STRICKEN WITH ATTACK OF APOPLEXY.

Quickly Recovered However and Expects to Resume Work.

St. Hyacinthe, Que., May 31.—Hon. M. E. Bernier, a member of the railway commission, was stricken unconscious yesterday by an attack of apoplexy.

He regained consciousness almost immediately, however, and wanted to take the train for Ottawa at once, but was advised by his physicians to remain at home several days.

Mr. Bernier feels no ill effects to-day, and hopes to be able to resume his duties very shortly.

NARROW ESCAPE.

Bridge Fell Just After Automobilists Crossed It.

Moncton, May 31.—The large touring automobile of Henry F. Huestis, of Providence, R. I., and containing Mr. and Mrs. Huestis and Mr. and Mrs. Robinson, had a narrow escape while enroute from St. John to Moncton last evening.

The machine ran over the bridge at Boundary Creek, near here, at a high rate of speed and had just struck the road on this side when the bridge fell.

A second sooner and the whole party would have been precipitated into the ravine, with probably fatal results.

LOST AN ARM.

Lamentable Accident at Jacquet River.

CUSTOMS RETURNS.

Large Increase for the Month — and for Past Eleven Months.

Ottawa, May 31.—The customs returns for the month closing today, show an increase this month of \$358,760 over May last year.

The figures for May, 1902, 3,051,238, May, 1903, \$3,409,999.

In the eleven months of the fiscal year closed today, the increase is \$3,747,097, the figures being for 11 months, 1902-1903: \$33,039,941; 1903-4, \$36,737,039.

Judge Forbes Pronounced Sentence on Job Lot

IN THE ST. JOHN COUNTY COURT.

Hurd Blair Henderson Given His Freedom.

Hurd Blair Henderson, who was tried for swindling Capt. J. E. Porter out of \$500 in a land deal, the jury disagreeing, was allowed his freedom on his own recognizance.
