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CARRIE NATION'S CAMPAIGN.

Kansas Saloon Smasher Made Characteristic Address

AT THE OPERA HOUSE.

Hit Out Freely at the Liquor and Other Evils.

HER ROUND OF THE HOTELS AND DRUG STORES.

Mrs. Carrie A. Nation, the famous saloon smasher and temperance "hatchetator" as she describes herself, addressed a mass meeting at the opera house last evening. There was a large audience present, nearly every seat being occupied up stairs and down. Mrs. Nation spoke for upwards of an hour, and got a splendid hearing, the bulk of the audience being apparently in entire accord with her views. The meeting was without a chairman, so she was obliged to introduce herself, but she got over the difficulty very easily. She gave a graphic account of her saloon smashing experiences in the state of Kansas, explained why she had been led to adopt such extreme measures, and told of her subsequent experiences with the authorities of the law. She strongly denounced the drink traffic and cigarette evil, and made an eloquent appeal to the people to rise in their might and shake off the yoke of bondage. She spoke without the aid of notes and never seemed to want for words to forcibly express her thoughts.

After introducing herself to the audience, Mrs. Nation launched right out upon a discussion of her subject. She said she had been represented all over this great country as being crazy, but such was not the case and she was only a plain woman and did what she believed to be her duty. Although Kansas was a prohibition state they had open bars there just as they have in Fredericton. She had paid a visit to some of the bars in

Fredericton and was told by the proprietor of the hotel that he kept a bar for his guests. She also learned from him that his guests included a number of the Legislators, and that she regarded as proof that there was something wrong with the government. She did what she thought to be right in Kansas and she did it because she was a mother and an American citizen. The Bible was her hatchet, and from it she derived her inspiration. She told about the unsuccessful efforts she put forth to have the law enforced against the saloons and how at last she had in desperation been forced to go into the

business. "My word is warfare," she said, my business is to fight the devil. I was not fitted out to go to heaven in a rocking chair. (Laughter) I was fitted for the battle fields. I knew I had to do something. I didn't want to see these things go on. If I had a thousand lives I would give them to my people. When I started out to smash my first saloon, I thought I was going to be killed. The day before I went to three different churches, the Methodist, Baptist and Presbyterian, and spoke to the women on the sin of wearing birds in their hats. I saw the choir looking like Vanity Fair, and I felt it my duty to say something. The next morning the words came to me in prayer "go to Kiowa and I'll stand by you." I was a woman fifty-five years of age, starting out against a nation, but I never faltered. No thoughtful person can follow my career and say there is not someone behind Carrie Nation. I went out into the yard and got a box full of rocks and putting them into my buggy started for Kiowa. I went into the saloon with the rocks in my arms and threw them as hard as I could, and I hit everything I aimed at. (Cheers).

Mrs. Nation went on to explain that she did not resort to the hatchet until her third expedition, when she found it was necessary to supplement the rocks. She had been

and on one occasion they had endeavored to prove her insane. A Fredericton druggist had told her she was crazy. That was the plan they all followed, as they did not want the great principle behind her to become known. It made her heart swell with pride to find such people in Canada as she did. I believe the liquor traffic is hell's conspiracy against women. I would rather be the means of destroying the destroyers than stand around and see our boys filling drunkard's graves. I went around among your dives in fulfillment of scripture. I did it because I am an agitator as well as a hatchetator. (Laughter.) It grieves me to know that your legislators countenance and encourage the liquor traffic. I am glad you have no liquor licenses here. It takes a sneak to buy it and a sneak to sell it in a place like this. (Applause). After this lecture I want to go out to a road house you have near here. The fathers and mothers of the province send their boys to Fredericton to be educated and you do wrong to allow such dives to flourish in your midst. You would be as much justified in breaking up these dives as you would be in breaking up a robber's den. They say the dive is kept by Miss Maggie Davis and that young men from the college go up there. (Laughter). You may laugh, but it is a

for you have nothing so valuable as these young boys made in the image of man. The power is with the people to break up these places and the hatchet was not used to close dives, but to arouse the people so they would close them. The hatchet has had its day and I never expect to smash another saloon in that way. In future I will smash the cause and not the effect. You don't attack the man for getting the smallpox but you attack the smallpox for getting the man. Don't depend on the government. Instead of the government reforming the people, the people are called upon to reform the government. You have a better smasher than I have in your votes. The man who would vote for a licensed saloon is as bad as an anarchist or a murderer. If your officers would do what they are sworn to do you wouldn't have a dive in your town. (Applause).

The Cigarette Evil.

I have seen your boys smoking cigarettes. I saw some of them doing it at the college. No boy can succeed in life who smokes cigarettes. Do you ever hear one of your legislators get up and disclaim against cigarettes. Our president is about the same way and they say he is a cigarette fiend himself. If your boys keep on smoking cigarettes you will have a nation of idiots and imbeciles. If a man produced the felt of an animal that destroys his hogs or his chickens, the state will give him a bounty, but there is no bounty for the curse that destroys our children.

COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE

Made its Report to the Legislature—Government Policy Commended.

In the legislature Friday afternoon, Mr. Ryan submitted the report of the committee on agriculture as follows:

Your committee have held three very interesting sessions all of which have been attended by the Honourable the Commissioner of Agriculture, and have discussed several subjects in connection with the improvement of stock and general agriculture.

Your committee have had under consideration the subject of giving special aid to agricultural societies, making importations of pure bred stock, and it was the feeling of the committee that such aid might be given, the breed of the animals to be determined by the local society, subject to the approval of the commissioner for agriculture.

Your committee note with pleasure the vigorous manner in which the work of the department of agriculture is being conducted, the results of which are now plainly seen by the farmers taking more interest in better stock, better care of same, great increase in dairy products, butter, cultivation of the soil, etc.

Your committee feel that the educational work being carried on under the farmers institute system, cannot help but be of great benefit to the farming industry.

The Hon. Mr. Farris drew the attention

of the committee to the fact, that districts in the counties of Carleton and Restigouche, and Gloucester, had their crops totally destroyed the past season by a severe hail storm and the inhabitants of these districts were in some instances unable to procure seed grain for this spring's planting, and have petitioned the government for some assistance.

After the matter had been fully discussed, it was unanimously resolved that in the opinion of this committee the govt. should be fully justified in acceding to the requests and have a distribution of seeds made through the department of agriculture.

The commissioner for agriculture explained to the committee the condition under which it is proposed to establish illustration orchards in each county of the province.

Your committee are of the opinion that in nearly all sections of the province hardy fruit such as apples, and plums can be successfully grown, and believe that the proposed work of illustrating the modern methods of cultivation and care of fruit trees is a step in the right direction.
