

NO HELP FOR JEWS

Amazing Speech by a Russian Minister.

SAYS THE JEWS ARE MURDERERS.

And Will Not be Granted Equal Rights With Christians.

New York, April 12.—The Sun today has the following from London: The hopelessness of the fate of the Jews in Russia so long as M. de Plehve, the minister of the interior, remains in power has been made abundantly clear by the extraordinary utterances of that functionary to a deputation of that race this week. He harangued them for an hour and a quarter without giving them a chance to speak.

The ingenueness of some of his statements was amazing. It is not true, he said, that the Czar and himself look on the Jews as a lower race. On the contrary, they consider them a superior race. If free entrance to the high schools were accorded the Jews they would attain too much power. It would not be just if the minority, he said, would overrule the majority. He had no doubt that those present were obedient sons of the fatherland, but he unfortunately had convinced himself that the Jews were the most notorious revolutionaries.

"You are not only revolutionaries," he said; you are murderers. My predecessor was shot by Balmaachen. The attempt made on the life of Prince Obolensky, Governor of Kharkoff, was perpetrated by a Christian, but all these murders and attempts at murder were inspired and prepared by Jews. I warn you that every war demands victims; take care.

"The government is inclined to improve the economical position of the Jews, but only very slowly and gradually. You need not count on obtaining equal rights with the Christian population. Were we to grant you equal rights the Kisbireff and Homel occurrences would be repeated to-morrow."

Canadian concern that is installing the great water power and electric transmission plant in the State of Puebla, ninety miles from the city, has just completed moving a town of 1,000 population.

The engineers found that the town of Necaxa occupied a site particularly suitable for the necessary reservoir, and the company forthwith purchased the entire town and moved it to a new location. All the buildings, including the Catholic cathedral, were razed and reconstructed on the new site. The new town bears the name of Canadita.

The initial capacity of the company's plant will be 45,000 horse power, and this will be increased to 80,000.
