TIDE OF IMMIGRATION.

Continues to Flow into the Northwest.

The great tide of immigration continues to flow unabated into the Canadian Northwest. Wednesday afternoon a C.P.R. train carrying 410 immigrants Galicians, and Doukaboors, passed through Montreal en route for Manitoba and the Northwest. It is quite unprecedented that immigration should continue so late in the season, but the great harvest and the high price of wheat is proving a wonderful attraction to foreigners. Those who passed through the city Wednesday came from Austria and the southern part of Russia, taking passage at Antwerp, on the Mount Temple and coming direct to Montreal. The immigrants coming out now are a very desirable lot, well furnished with money and understanding thoroughly agricultural pursuits and eminently fitted in every way to "rough it." Contrary to reports current the Galicians are proving excellent settlers, the great majority are thrifty and hard workers. Last year fully one million dollars were sent home by them to their friends to assist in bringing them out and those passing through Wednesday were going out to friends.

On an average, three trains each week carrying immigrants, pass through the city, but the great rush begins in February. The advent of the turbine-driven boats is a great aid to immigrants, as it is now possible to cross the ocean in seven days. The cut rates now prevailing is also a great benefit.

A large number of high-class immigrants are also coming out from Great Britain, men well provided with money, of good character, steady and thrifty. For instance, one of the C. P. R. "newbies" told of an English immigrant handing him five sovereigns at different times for goods, between Montreal and Ottawa. The major part of them also come out as second-class passengers.

Altogether the outlook for immigration is very bright, and there is no need for alarm that the Northwest will be settled by any undesirable class of immigrants. A constant improvement along that line is quite noticeable.

LAUGHED AT MR. MORLEY.

When He Spoke of Tariff for Revenue Only.

New York, Nov. 16.—In the heart of protection's stronghold, among protection's greatest friends and beneficiaries, at the annual banquet of the New York Chamber of Commerce, John Morley, England's great commoner, last night delivered a free-trade speech.

"I have seen nothing in your country to make me believe," said Mr. Morley, "that you wouldn't have been just as great, just as mighty, just as prosperous, just as strong as you are today if you had taken for your motto that worn-out shibboleth, 'Tariff for revenue only.'"

J. Pierpont Morgan, Andrew Carnegie, Cornelius N. Bliss, Alexander E. Orr and a score of other stalwart protectionists gazed curiously at the speaker as he eloquently delivered his statement, and then a burst of good-natured laughter swept over the room, followed by a mighty cheer.

Mr. Morley paused and studied his audience critically. Then, as the cheer subsided, he said, half-waismatically, half-seriously:—

"Well, if that is all, if that is the attitude, I don't think I need have taken the trouble to testify."
