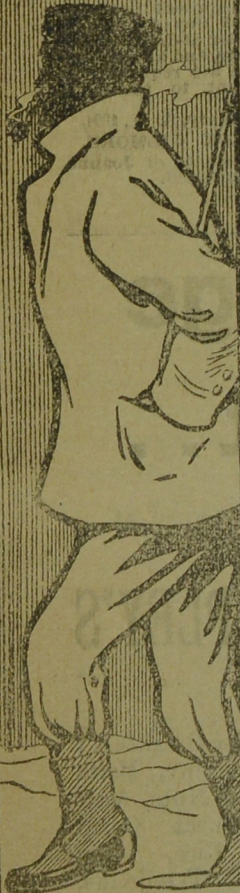

Rubber "Biscuits"
