

EARL GREY,

Brother of Lady Minto, Appointed

GOVERNOR GENERAL OF CANADA.

Has Sat in Parliament as a Liberal.

AND FOR TWO YEARS ADMINISTERED GOVERNMENT OF RHODESIA.

(Special to Daily Herald.)

London, June 11.—It is announced that Earl Grey, Lord Lieut. of Northumberland, has been appointed to succeed the Earl of Minto as governor general of Canada.

Albert Henry Grey, fourth Earl Grey, whose appointment as governor general of Canada is announced, has had already some colonial experience, having been administrator of Rhodesia for two years, from 1896 to 1897.

He was born November 25, 1851, and is a son of General Hon. Charles Grey.

He was educated at Harrow, Trinity College, Cambridge, where he was senior law history tripos in 1873.

He entered politics in 1880, when he was elected Liberal M. P. for South Northumberland. For the short parliament 1885-6 he sat for Tynside Division, Northumberland, and since 1899 he has been Lord Lieutenant of Northumberland.

Earl Grey is a brother of Lady Minto, and came out to Canada a couple of years ago when he visited Rideau Hall for several weeks. He has one son and five daughters.

Lord Grey's wife, whom he married in 1877 is a daughter of the late Robert Staynor Helford, M. P. for Gloucester.

CRISIS NEAR.

Siege of Port Arthur
Matter of Serious
Import.

RUSSIANS PRAY FOR SUCCESS OF THEIR ARMS.

Believed that Kuropatkin
Cannot Relieve the City.

(Special to Daily Herald.)

St. Petersburg, June 11.—There is a feeling in all circles that a crisis in affairs at Port Arthur is rapidly approaching, and in several quarters most pessimistic feeling as to the outcome is expressed.

Many persons spent last night in the churches on their knees praying for the success of the Russian arms.

In semi-official quarters it is thought the advance of the Japanese under Kuroki had made it impossible for Kuropatkin to proceed southward and that the garrison at the fort must fight it out without reinforcements.

A rumor that Port Arthur had fallen, reached here this morning, but it is not confirmed.

St. Petersburg, June 11.—The official army organ, in concluding an article on the military situation in the far east, inclines to the belief that fighting has occurred in front of Port Arthur, and that the Japanese sustained severe reverses.

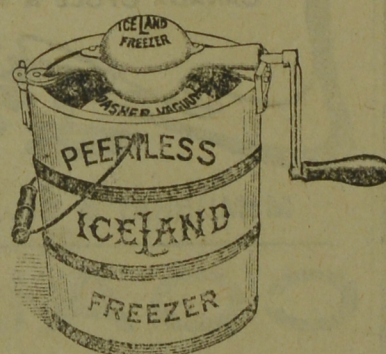
