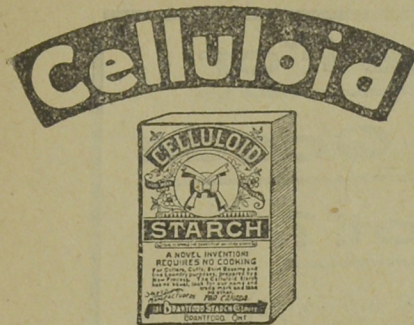

WILL IMPORT MOLASSES.

Wholesale Merchants Have Formed a Combine.

THINK THEY CAN DO BUSINESS MORE CONVENIENTLY THAN AT PRESENT.

In this week's issue of the Royal Gazette letters patent are granted to the following for the purpose of carrying on a general wholesale business in molasses, sugar, groceries, provisions and other food stuffs: Simeon A. Jones, F. B. Schofield, Hall & Fairweather, W. C. Cross, Andrew Malcolm, F. G. Bent, Thos. Gorman, C. W. DeForest, F. W. Hatheway & Co., I. H. Northrup, W. M. Barlow and W. C. Purves, all of St. John; A. H. F. Randolph, R. W. Randolph, G. W. Hodge, Frederickton; J. W. Y. Smith, J. F. Edgett, J. H. Harris, Moncton; A. I. Teed Co. and W. E. Graham, St. Stephen. The company to be known as The New Brunswick Importing Co., capital stock \$25,000 divided into 250 shares of \$100 each.

It is learned that the organization is a combine of wholesale merchants formed for the purpose of importing molasses. In the past while several of the dealers interested in the new company have at odd times imported direct from Barbadoes and Porto Rico, they have depended for the greater portion of their stock on Baird, Peters and L. G. Crosby. The molasses market has taken some peculiar freaks during the past few years and the merchants mentioned above claim that they can procure their stocks more conveniently and perhaps more economically than at present. The idea is not, so far as can be learned, to compete against present importers, but only to secure enough to fill their own orders.

The Destruction of Romance.

DRAGGED UNDER WATER.

A Medical Man Relates His Feelings During the Experience.

A medical man described in a recent issue of a Scotch medical journal his experiences when dragged under water with a foundered ship. He struck out to reach the surface, but only went further down. This exertion was a serious waste of breath, and after what appeared to be ten or fifteen seconds, the effort of inspiration could be no longer restrained, and pressure on the chest began to develop. The most striking thing to be remembered was the great pain in the chest, which was increased at every effort of expiration and inspiration. It seemed as if the sufferer were in a vise, which was gradually being screwed up tight, until it felt as if the breastbone and backbone would break. The "gurgling" process became more frequent for about ten efforts, and hope was then extinguished. The pressure after these gulps seemed unbearable, but gradually the pain eased up, as carbonic acid accumulated in the blood, owing to the absence of air in the lungs. At the same time the efforts at inspiration with their accompanying gulps of water occurred at longer and longer intervals. The writer's mental condition then was such that he appeared to be in a pleasant dream, but still had enough will power to think of friends at home, etc. Before finally losing consciousness, the chest pain had completely disappeared, and sensation was actually pleasant. When consciousness returned, the surgeon found himself on the surface of the water, and he finally managed to reach the shore. The writer goes on to describe the very unpleasant effects of large gulps of sea water, and the tortures to be endured in the restoration of the circulation in the almost drowned, and concludes by hoping that death by drowning will not again be described as a pleasant form of death.
