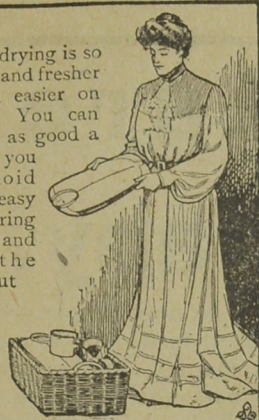

Reciprocity With Canada.

Toronto, August 24.—The World this morning has the following despatch from Oyster Bay, N. Y.: President Roosevelt is alarmed by the magnitude of the demand for Canadian reciprocity in New England, which the national administration has so far ignored, as far as definite action is concerned, and will take the matter up in his letter of acceptance. From what standpoint he will deal with it and what recommendation he may make is not disclosed at present.

The President's idea is, however, that something must be done. He expressed the fear that New England would show a great Republican defection, especially in Massachusetts, due to the scant recognition given reciprocity in the Chicago platform.

The issue was the subject of a long and grave discussion at Sagamore Hill on the part of the President, Senator Lodge, of Massachusetts, and Senator Aldrich, of Rhode Island. The President sent for Senator Lodge to visit him at his earliest convenience and the Massachusetts Senator arrived late last night. While he was talking things over with the President, Senator Aldrich, father-in-law of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., arrived unexpectedly.

Senator Lodge endeavored to persuade the President he had no reason to feel any alarm about New England. Senator Aldrich argued vigorously as the spokesman for the protected interests of New England against any concession to the reciprocity shoulers of Boston, and urged that the party, and President, too, were committed to a stand-pat course.

A WONDERFUL WARDROBE.

New York, Aug., 24.—The Herald today has the following from London:—Nine hundred lots of clothing make up the wonderful wardrobe of the Marquis

of Anglesey as classified in the auctioneer's catalogue for sale by public auction at Anglesey Castle.

The Marquis, it was well known fancied himself in a new garment with gleeful enthusiasm, but it was not supposed he carried his sartorial equipment to the extent of 227 suits, 362 fancy waistcoats, 100 overcoats, 61 lounge suits, 73 smoking suits, 8 kilts, 142 pairs of boots and slippers, 150 pairs of pajamas, 278 pairs of gloves, 82 dressing gowns, 29 bathing gowns and 450 ties.

The fancy waistcoats, being so inconveniently numerous, will be sold six at a time, and the suits will be knocked down in lots of two. Twelve pairs of kid gloves must be taken in each lot. The gowns will be offered singly. Some are in heliotrope, others in pink, many in fawn silk. One gown has a green silk ground with birds and flowers beautifully worked in silk. Seven are made of Japanese rice cloth in various colors.

The grandest item is a sable overcoat with twenty tails and ten head fronts, for which the Marquis is reported to have given £1,000.

EXTENDING THEIR BUSINESS.

Messrs Randolph and Sons Opening Warehouse at Chatham.

Chatham World,—Messrs. A. F. Randolph and Sons, wholesale grocers of Fredericton, are opening a branch of their wholesale business here, and have rented the warehouse belonging to Mr. E. A. Strang, Connard street, immediately back of Mr. Strang's brick store. Mr. H. E. Strang has accepted the position of warehouseman, and is closing his store in the Odd Fellows' Hall building. Messrs. Randolph intend to carry a general line of heavy and light groceries at Chatham, and all goods which can be shipped direct to Chatham to better advantage than having them come via some other shipping point will be brought here in car lots, thus enabling them to sell goods to the trade of Chatham and vicinity at the same price which they would have to pay at St. John of Fredericton, thereby effecting a large saving in freight, as all goods will be delivered by Messrs. Randolph's team the same day as ordered. It will also be a convenience to the trade to get special delivery and save cartages. Messrs. Randolph intend to do only a jobbing business, and will limit their business exclusively to the retail trade.

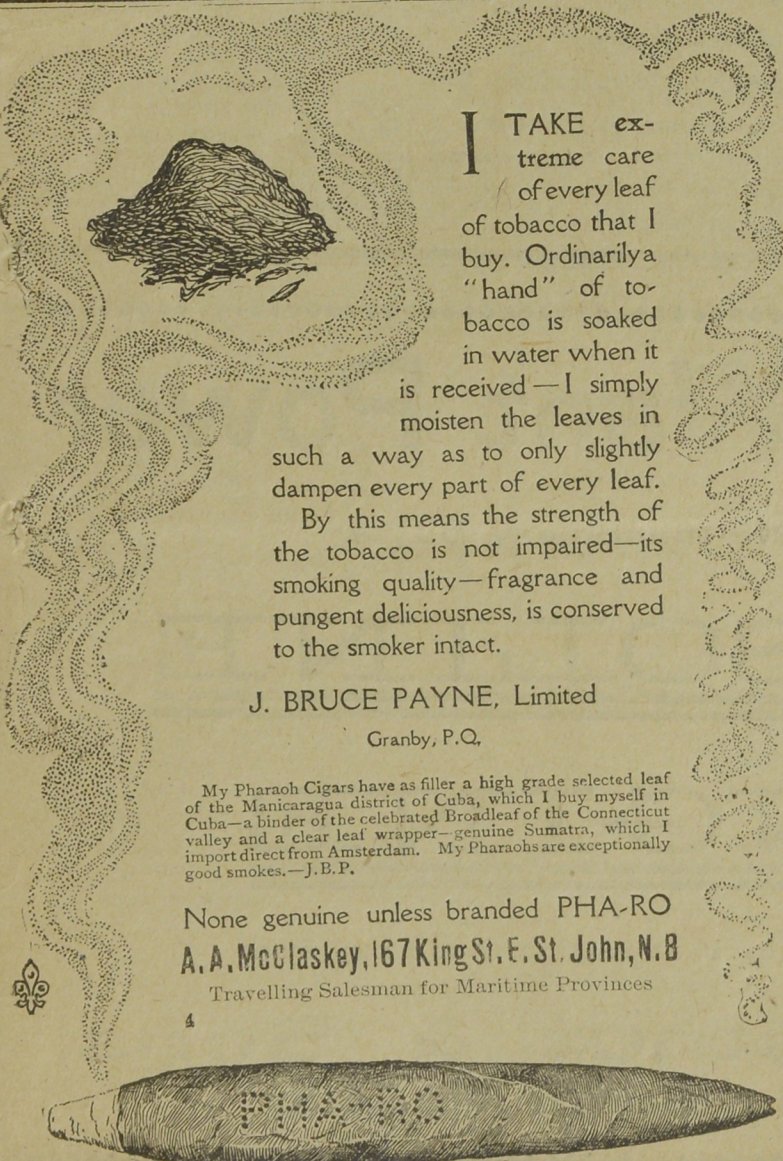
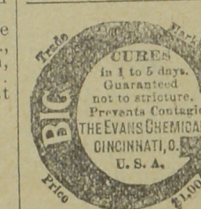
