New York is Wide Open.

New York, Jan. 6.—District Attorney Jerome appeared in court to-day and stated to Judge Cowing, just before the latter sentenced a woman and man convicted of pool-selling, that poolrooms had been opening all over the city for the last three months at the rate of three a day. He said he could furnish the addresses of thirty poolrooms running now. "I know it is unusual for the District Attorney or his assistants to appear when a prisoner is being sentenced to ask that no leniency be shown, but I understand that there has been a plan formed by poolroom keepers of this city to tie the hands of the District Attorney, so that he cannot prosecute them."
