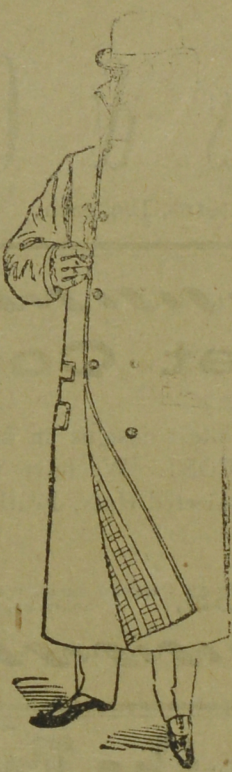

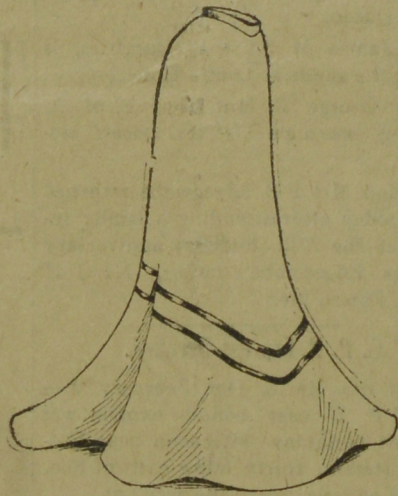

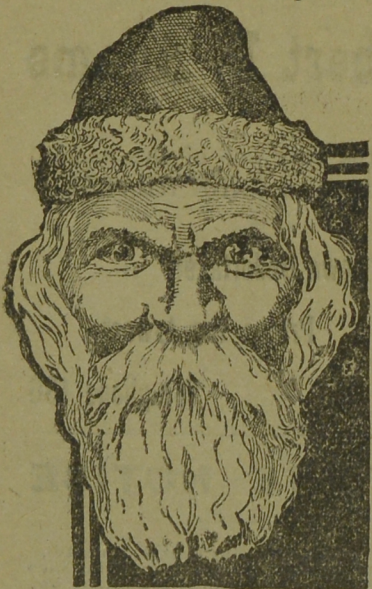
Marysville News.

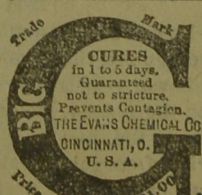
