## A REMARKABLE EVENT.

Senator Wark, a respected citizen of Fredericton is one of the great wonders of the world.

Today he completed a century of life, and mentally and physically he is the equal of plenty of people half his age.

What are the secrets of his great longevity? No doubt two of them are the hardy north of Ireland stock from which he sprung, and his temperate habits, and careful method of living. In his youth the Senator must have been a powerful man, with his stockily built frame, still remarkably erect.

The Senator has been largely in the public eye since he was a young man in the twenties. His public career may be said to have started when in 1826 he opened a school at the Bend, now the prosperous city of Moncton, and in which service he continued at Richibucto until 1832. From that date till ten years later he gave attention to the private business of a merchant, in 1842 the people of Kent elected him to the House of Assembly, and he has been in political life ever since without a break. Think of it! Sixty-two years a member of legislative bodies:—nine years in the assembly, sixteen in the legislative council and thirty-seven years in the senate of Canada.

And Senator Wark was never a drone in the hive of public life. He was active in advocating important reforms, especially in giving the people of New Brunswick greater postal facilities, wider educational advantages, two points that closely touch the life of the people, and was an ardent advocate of the great measure of confederation which cemented the scattered British colonies of North America into a great nationality. Senator Wark has left his mark on the legislation of New Brunswick.

Having lived under five Sovereigns, the Senator has seen great changes, has existed amidst the great history making period of the British Empire, and had his share in the development of one of His Majesty's most important colonies. What a mass of material and intellectual advance is covered by the century of his life.

While we unite in honoring Senator Wark on account of the great age to which he has attained, and for his valuable public services, we lay tribute at his feet for the honorable reputation he has built up and maintained during his long life. No stigma ever attached to his name, and his career is a pattern to all men who desire to leave to posterity a record of clean, pure private and public life. Senator Wark always put duty first and vacillation, deceit and double dealing have had no place in his career.

No words of praise today spoken in his presence by those gathered under his hospitable roof to celebrate his centennial, or printed in the press of the country, magnify his virtues or overstate the beauty of his life.

The venerable gentleman enters upon his second century of life amid the hearty acclaims of his countrymen, with his intellectual capacity practically unimpaired, his physical strength remarkable for his great years, and with consciousness of a life well spent in the service of his country and his God.

## FOR THE WORLD'S FAIR.

The Intercolonial Railway will Make an Attractive Exhibit.

Mr. W. L. Creighton, advertising agent of the I. C. R., was in the city yesterday looking for specimens in the game line to be exhibited at the St. Louis Fair. He closed a bargain with Emack Bros., taxidermists, for three splendid deer

heads, and procured the loan from them of a large moose head having an antler spread of sixty inches. While here Mr. Creighton met Mr. W. T. Chesnut, who kindly consented to loan the I. C. R. for the exposition his mammoth caribou head taken on the Northwest Miramichi last fall. Mr. Creighton made an effort to procure Emack Bros. record moose-head for the exposition, but was a little too late as the firm have about closed a bargain for its sale.

Mr. Creighton expects to leave for St. Louis about April 1st, with the I. C. R. exhibit and will remain at the fair until the close. He has procured a large space and will fill it up with a very attractive exhibit, showing off the fish and game resources of the country served by the I. C. R. A feature of the exhibit will be three large glass tanks, one containing live salmon, one sea bass, and the other trout.

During his stay in the city, Mr. Creighton met the members of the Fredericton Tourist Association, and kindly offered to distribute copies of the Fredericton booklet at the World's Fair.
