SEIZED DIAMOND BROOCH.

Audacious Highway Robbery in New York City.

New York, Feb. 21.—One of the most audacious of the many recent robberies in this city occurred in the Bronx early today, when a highwayman attacked Mr. and Mrs. John W. Cornish in front of their home, snatched a \$5,000 diamond brooch from Mrs. Cornish and fired two bullets through the clothing of Mr. escaped after an exciting race with a policeman, in which several shots were exchanged.

Mr. and Mrs. Cornish had attended a theatre and supper. They attracted much attention in the car because of their lavish display of diamonds. When they left the car a young man also got off, and as they reached their house he quickened his pace, until he was beside Mrs. Cornish.

"I beg your pardon, madam," said he, "but I must have that," and he grabbed the brooch from Mrs. Cornish's dress. Before he could get away Mr. Cornish demanded the return of the brooch, at the same time threatening the man with his cane. The highwayman drew a revolver and fired two shots at Mr. Cornish, one going through his overcoat, while the other went through his hat.

Pasadena, Ont., Feb. 21.—Last night a shocking double railway fatality happened here. Mrs. Thomas Hanna, a widow, residing at 13 Lake street, was returning by the Grand Trunk from Port Hope. SHERIFF FINED THE CAT.

Knew All About Flirting and Women's Hearts.

London, Feb. 21.—The Times publishes the following:—In the court of Session, Edinburgh, before the Lord Justice Clerk, Alfred Toms, and others, nephews of the late Sheriff Toms of Orkney, sought to have their uncle's will altered on the ground that he was not of sound mind. The evidence showed that Sheriff Toms died worth \$80,000, and by the will, executed in March, 1903, he gave certain sums to his nephews and made other bequests, but constituted the magistrates of Kirkwall his residuary legatees, devoting about 360,000 to the restoration of Kirkwall Cathedral.

Mr. Hunter, in opening the case for the plaintiffs, gave examples of the sheriff's eccentricities. He had a favorite cat called Sambo, which he fined when it did anything wrong, the fine never being over a penny. He had a mirror over his bed, so that he could see himself when he was sleeping. He had a laughing waistcoat, which he wore going out to dinners, and in which he kept some camphor as an antidote to matrimonial infection. In the deed executed in March, 1903, he directed that he was to be buried in Morningside Cemetery, Edinburgh, in a wicker coffin, so as to have a chance to be in early at the general scramble at the resurrection. At a later date he directed that his body was to be cremated and the ashes to be deposited in the ladies room at St. Giles Cathedral.

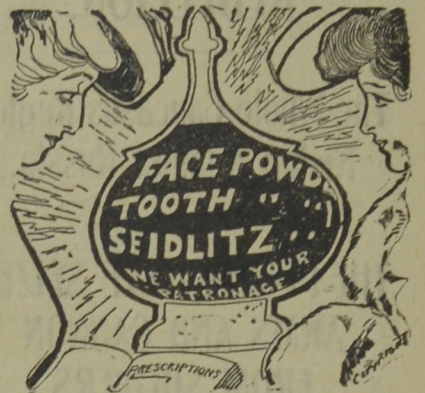

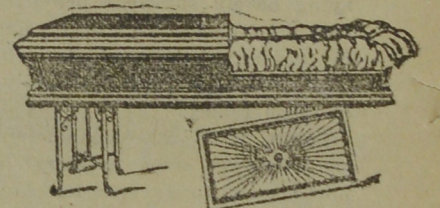
