THE LATE MRS. LEGERE.

Wife of Kent's Sheriff Died at Richibucto.

Richibucto Review.—At Richibucto, on Monday last, Mrs. A. Leger, wife of Sheriff Leger, died of pleuropneumonia after a short illness. The disease as it first appeared was an ordinary case of pleurisy and no serious result was expected. On Friday last, pneumonia developed and although three physicians were in attendance, nothing could be done for her.

The deceased lady, who was fifty-one years of age at the time of her death, was a daughter of the late Amie Hebert, a highly respected farmer of Cocagne, where she was born. Besides her husband she is survived by ten children, all of whom were present at the deathbed. The sons are, Nap. P., of the I. C. R. offices, Moncton; J. Amedee, civil engineer, Chatham; Theophile, attending St. Joseph's College; John Arthur and Eric at home. The daughters are, Eugenie, attending the Provincial Normal School at Fredericton; Lucy, Yvonne and Albertina at home.

The funeral took place yesterday. The remains were followed to the R. C. Church, and thence to the R. C. burying ground, Richibucto, where interment took place, by a large number of citizens of Richibucto and Rexton, besides a number from outside points.

MILITARY RUMORS.

Officers Who Are Named for Important Commands in Canada.

Ottawa, April 8.—The minister of militia is said to have resolved upon a number of important military appointments in connection with the scheme of a military reorganization. According to report Col. Otter will command the Western Ontario military district with headquarters as at present in Toronto and rank of Brigadier-General; Lieut-Colonel Gordon will be transferred from Montreal to Kingston to command the Eastern Ontario division; Lieut-Colonel Buchanan will be transferred from Kingston to Montreal to command the troops in the Province of Quebec.

It is also reported that Lieut.-Col. Drury will be given the command of the Halifax fortifications and the garrison there, and that Lieut.-Col. Wilson will be placed in charge of the garrison and field artillery at other points throughout Canada.
