ASSASSINATIONS.

Previous Slaughter that has
Marked Russia's History.

STORY OF THE ROMANOFF DYNASTY

One of Bloodshed and Assassination.

The story of the Romanoff dynasty in the past century is one of bloodshed and assassination. Emperor Paul, great-grandfather of Grand Duke Sergius, who reigned from seventeen ninety-six to eighteen one, was assassinated on the night of March twenty-third, eighteen one, by being strangled in the Mikhailovskii Palace, just as he had entered into an agreement with Napoleon Bonaparte to invade the British possessions in India.

Nicholas first, his grandson, was a despot and iron-handed prince, and put down revolution on the very day the troops were called up to take the oath of allegiance to him.

Alexander second, who succeeded Nicholas first, had repeated attempts made upon his life. He was a liberal and humane monarch, but his governments repressed the revolutionists severely. He was shot at in his capital, and the train in which he was supposed to be travelling was blown up by an elaborate mine beneath the railway, and a destructive explosion was effected by dynamite placed beneath the imperial apartments in the winter palace at St. Petersburg. He was injured by a bomb thrown at him while riding in a sleigh near his palace. He died two hours afterwards.

His son, Alexander third, who succeeded him, escaped assassination, although attempts were made to take his life by the Nihilists. He died at Livadia, in the Crimea, his eldest son becoming the present Czar, Nicholas second.

In the last four years the assassin has been busy in Russia. Last year Minister of the Interior Von Plehve was assassinated while driving to the Baltis Station to visit the Emperor at the Peterhof Palace. A bomb thrown under the minister's carriage completely shattered it. M. Von Plehve was terribly mangled and the coachman was killed. The tragedy occurred in the Yahalsky prospect, a broad thoroughfare lead-

ing up to the Warsaw station. The force of the explosion was so terrific that it not only broke every window within a radius of half a mile, but reduced the heavy paving-stones to powder, heaved up the pavement, and hurled a heavy piece of the iron-work of the carriage across the canal, severing the thick mast of a barge. The minister's head was battered almost beyond recognition. The assassin was a Finn named Leglo, or Porozoff, who was himself injured and immediately arrested.

This crime was generally regarded as intimately connected with a far-reaching terrorist plot, revealed in the summer of nineteen hundred and three by the arrest of Gerschunin, the Russian revolutionary agitator, at Kieff, where he had gone to organize an attempt on the Emperor's life at Saroff, during the ceremonies incident to the canonization of St. Serephim. The subsequent trial established the fact that Gerschunin was the head of a murderous conspiracy, the object being to create a reign of terror by killing ministers, governors and the emperor himself.

The series of crimes resulting from this conspiracy begun with the attempt on the life of Privy Councillor Pobiedonosteff, Chief Procurator of the Holy Synod, who was fired at by a man named Logowski, and included the killing of M. Boganovit-

ch, ex-governor-general of Ufa, European Russia; M. Bologieff, former minister of public instruction, and M. Sipiaguine, M. Von Plehve's successor, and the attempts, on Prince Obolensky, now governor-general of Finland, while governor-general of Kharkoff he being fired on four times and Prince Galitzin, governor-general of the Caucasus, who was stabbed by three natives on the outskirts of Tiflis. The more recent murders of Governor-general Bobrikoff of Finland, who was shot by Eugene Schumann and died the following morning, and of Vice-governor Andrieff of Elizabethpol, Transcaucasia, assassinated July seventeenth last, were also connected with this plot.

The most recent assassination was that of Soisalon Soinen, procurator-general, who was shot on the sixth of the present month at Helsinki, by a Finn named Karl Lenard Hobenthal, who, disguised as an officer, gained admission to the apartments of the minister. And now follows the murder of the Grand Duke Sergius.

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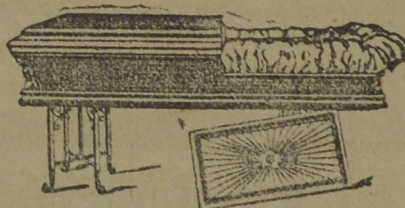
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
