A FOG IN LONDON.

What it Means to the Great Metropolis to be Shrouded in Mist.

What is generally considered to be the worst fog known in London for a number of years descended on that city just before Christmas.

Matters of a social nature were entirely at a standstill, dozens of dinner parties being countermanded, for people could not reach their destinations.

Shortly after 1 o'clock, omnibuses, automobiles, vans laden with Christmas goods, broughams, hansoms and vehicles of all kinds were absolutely blocked, and it was almost impossible to cross the road, so dark was it.

To cross the street was a danger to one's life, for one never knew when a bus or van, no matter how slowly driven, might appear through the fog and throw you down.

One feature of the day was the great good humor which prevailed. Under such trying conditions nobody seemed to get flurried, and the police never showed up so well in regulating the traffic, holding back the vehicles to allow the crowds to pass the streets, while the passengers showed a philosophic resignation to the slow progress.

When business men left their homes in the morning to make their way to their offices, they were so delayed that, judging from the manner in which the local trains were held up on the lines, and from the frequent blocks on the streets, multitudes could not have reached their offices till two or more hours late, and as the day wore on, the conditions became worse and worse.

Walking on the pavements, it was possible to see even the curbstone. Bus drivers had to leave their perches and lead their horses along, while the conductors piloted, or tried to pilot their way with a lantern.

But, bad as it was in the city, even worse conditions prevailed in the suburbs. Brilliantly lighted shops in Clapham, for instance, were quite useless in lighting up even the pavements, and the centre of the streets was impenetrable darkness.

Shopkeepers, much to their consternation, had to stop delivering their Christmas goods either by van or by hand, and some bus drivers in despair had to give up even leading their horses, and had to tell their passengers they could risk going no farther.

The Daily Mail, in its description of the fog, says: "London had suddenly become a strange new city; its newly-acquired mystery caused the greatest wonderment among those who knew the metropolis best."

The spacious streets had become a solid mass of gray, just as solid as the mass of gray which hid the buildings on each side. The world was suddenly an intangible, inviolable cloud, through which one saw pin-points of lights. The pin-points were the electric street lamps.

Somewhere there were houses and shops and towering offices, and phantom voices came from out of the gray cloud. They were human beings a few yards away, but quite invisible.

Outside the theatres for long after the closing hours, men and women stood waiting in the vain hope for carriages, cabs and omnibuses to appear. The commissionaires did all they could to find vehicles, but hundreds of people were left to face the choice of walking home or spending the night in hotels.

Annual Meeting Promises to be one of Unusual Interest.

The meeting of the Farmers' and Dairy-men's Association of New Brunswick at Fredericton, on the 25th, 26th and 27th, first promises to be an event of more than usual interest to the farmers of New Brunswick.

The different discussions that will be

taken up include, "The Improvement of Seeds," "The Preparation of the Soil for Crop Growing," and "How the Fertility of the Soil May be Economically increased." The fact that, over \$200,000 per year is sent out of the province for beef should create a general interest in the discussion upon "How Shall New Brunswick Farmers Produce More and Better Beef."

The great value of the dairy industry to the province is recognized in the discussions which will be introduced upon the "Essentials to Success in Dairy Farming" and the "Manufacturing of Dairy Products."

Our apple growing interests will receive special attention and the newly organized Provincial Fruit Growers Association will put on a special evening programme.

The important subject of "Agricultural Education" will be reported upon by special committee, the whole question considered and the opinion of the Association crystallized in the form of resolutions. The value of nature study in our rural schools will be demonstrated by Prof. John Brittain, and the chairman of the board of trustees of the Kingston Consolidated School will address the meeting upon the "Practical Advantages or Disadvantages of the Consolidated School System as now in operation at Kingston."

There will be single fares on all rail ways on the standard certificate plan.

London, Jan. 16.—The Daily Express publishes the following: "After a series of campaigns, extending, roughly, over a period of four years involving a loss of over 350 killed and about 250 wounded, and costing, it is estimated, £3,000,000, the British government has, it is understood, finally abandoned any intention of bringing the Mad Mullah to book, and has left him master of the situation."

Italy, through its agents, Signor Pestalozzi, Consul General at Aden, and Signor Senare, the well-known African explorer, has concluded, with the tacit co-operation of Britain, an agreement with Mahommed Abdulla, the so-called Mad Mullah, whereby, in return for a guarantee of immunity from attack, the latter agrees to respect the territory over which Italy exercises a protectorate.

The Mullah thus gains all he has been fighting for—practically undisturbed dominion over the Somali-land interior and its numerous so-called friendly tribes, who are now to be left to their own resources.

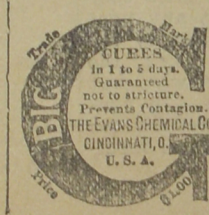
