Ontario Finances in Good Shape.

Bowmanville, Ont., Jan. 10.—"There is cash in the banks to the credit of the Province of Ontario amounting to \$4,747,697 when the banks closed yesterday," was the announcement of Hon. Richard Harcourt at a meeting here last night in the interest of Mr. Wm. Rickard, Liberal candidate in West Durham.

The announcement was occasioned by Mr. Whitney's recent query as to whether the Ontario cash balance did not include the money borrowed on the Temiskaming Railway bonds. Mr. Harcourt, as the minister who went to England in connection with these bonds was particularly able to talk on the subject, and he gave Mr. Whitney's insinuation a most absolute denial.

The other speaker of the evening, in addition to Mr. Rickard, was Mr. J. A. MacDonald, who, in a brief and forceful address, gave several strong reasons why men of independent mind should support the Ross government.

BETTER TERMS.

This May be an Item in the Federal Bill of Fare.

Quebec, Jan. 9.—Hon. Charles Fitzpatrick, Minister of Justice, arrived in Quebec on Saturday from Ottawa, and had a lengthy conference with Hon. S. N. Parent, Premier of the province, at the latter's private residence.

It is rumored in political circles that the minister of justice came here representing the Dominion Government to confer in respect to the demand made by the province of Quebec for an increase of its subsidy. It is not known definitely what transpired at the interview between the provincial premier and the minister of justice but it is thought that an understanding was arrived at, which will meet with the approval of both governments, and hasten a settlement of the question which concerns all the provinces. This question, together with the autonomy of the Northwest Territories, will, it is said, be embodied in the speech from the throne, at the opening of the Dominion Parliament, and no doubt will be the

principal feature of legislation at the coming session in conjunction with several important amendments to the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway bill.

The greatest and only difficulty foreseen here in connection with the proposed autonomy for the Northwest Territories is the question of education. It is feared that Archbishop Langevin will again jump into the political arena to make trouble for the government, but the general belief among Liberal politicians is that he will get little sympathy from the thinking French Canadian Catholics of the Province of Quebec, who are satisfied to leave the settlement of this question of religious tolerance altogether in the hands of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, with every confidence in his ability and spirit of fair play to see the interests of the Catholic population properly safeguarded.

FITZ'S LION HITS BOY.

Actor-Pugilist's Pet Got Hungry Behind the Scenes.

Robert Fitzsimmons, the pugilist, owns a pet lion which, with a sweep of its paw early Monday night, cut a gash over the eye of Thomas Laughlin, eleven years old, who is employed as a cleaner's helper in the Olympic Theatre, at One Hundred and Thirtieth Street and Third Avenue, New York. An ambulance surgeon took four stitches in the boy's wound.

Fitzsimmons has been appearing in a play at the theatre, and he allowed the lion, which is eleven months old and nearly as large as a full grown St. Bernard dog, to have the run of the space back of the curtain. Young Laughlin was walking along the wide passageway in front of the dressing rooms and carrying a bundle of papers. Theatre attaches said the lion thought the boy had food for him, it being the time when he usually was fed, and made a lunge for the papers, not intending to injure the boy. At all events, his paw swept across Laughlin's forehead, and hurt the boy badly.

Laughlin was not frightened. He gave the lion a kick, and called to Fitzsimmons, who was in a nearby dressing room, to lock his beast in a cage. The pugilist caught the lion by the neck, whipped him severely, and pushed him into the cage.

Just before the lion made the lunge at the boy the lion was playing with a little girl. It is said that both the boy and girl thought the lion was a big dog.
