

THE CIGARETTE EVIL.

Superintendent Ferrier of an Ontario Industrial School
Tells What He Knows.

HOW LADS ARE DRAGGED DOWN BY BANEFUL PRACTICE--THE EFFECT
ON MIND AND MORALS.

In a recent talk on "The Effects of Cigarettes on Boys" to the Municipal Reform League, Mr. C. Ferrier, of the Victoria Industrial School, Mimico, Ontario, attributes a large part of crime to the cigarette habit. He has been at the industrial school among the boys for nine years, and has made the cigarette habit a study. He claims that there is no habit like it in destroying the life of a boy.

SEVEN OUT OF TEN.

"I think," said Mr. Ferrier, "that seven out of every ten boys at the school are addicted to the cigarette habit. I am of the opinion that it has more to do with bringing boys to the school than anything else. It is associated with and responsible for much of the crime that is committed. I have noticed that a cigarette smoker has no will power. There seems to be something in them that deadens the will."

"I have noticed also that boys addicted to the cigarette habit readily yield to temptation, have no power of resistance, and are invariably liars. There are, I believe, more criminals among the cigarette smokers than in any other class."

EFFECT ON MORALS.

"A boy who smokes does not get a chance to do so at school, or at home, therefore he begins to take school hours for it. He plays truant and smokes in lanes and other out-of-the-way places. He will probably write an excuse and forge his mother's name. When that is exhausted he will play truant all the time. The principal notifies the parents, then the truant officer, and finally the boy is brought before the magistrate. He is then sent to this school. Behind it all is the cigarette."

"The craving boys have for tobacco is terrible. Why I believe some of them would sell their soul to get either one. They cannot sleep and will practice all kinds of deceit."

MENTAL EFFECT.

"One of the many cases here was a young boy in whom the teacher could not arouse mental activity. We wrote to his mother, and the answer came back that he had been smoking cigarettes. His mind was sluggish, and we could get no incentive into

the boy until the smoking effects gradually wore off and he became quite smart. Tobacco in any form—cigarettes chiefly, though—will render the mental power sluggish."

With regard to the effects on the physical condition of a boy, Mr. Ferrier stated that a doctor, in the course of an address at the school, said that cigarette smoking arrested the mental and physical development. A child of a smoker was not in physical condition up to the standard, as was also the case with the nervous system. The poison from the cigarette at once affected the nerve and the nerve the brain, and would also cause trouble in other generations. Boys have to contend with a lot of temptation to break off smoking.

A PROBABLE REMEDY.

"Now, what is there to do to stop it?" said Mr. Ferrier. "The men themselves must try and abstain from smoking for the sake of the boys. Why, some men come around the school and smoke in the presence of the boys. The boys say, 'if those prominent men smoke, we can,' and that is how it goes."

"The W. C. T. U. are all right, but their plan of teaching the effects of drinking and smoking in the schools—I doubt if it does any good. I never knew of a boy yet that was stopped that way. When they once get into it any amount of telling the effects will not stop them smoking. What the business men and any employer should do is to not hire any boy that smokes cigarettes. The dollars and cents will appeal to the boys first of anything. If that was made a rule, I think it would have a good effect."

"Another good remedy, if it were possible, would be to form anti-cigarette clubs for the boys, and get them interested in the movement. These clubs have been formed by the prominent men in Detroit, and one scarcely sees a boy with a cigarette in this month over there. The law against selling cigarettes—and there is one in Toronto—is not strictly enforced. But the law they have is hard to enforce. If the sale of cigarettes was prohibited, and the anti-cigarette organizations backed up by the police and magistrate, it would be a way to stop the use of these deadly things."

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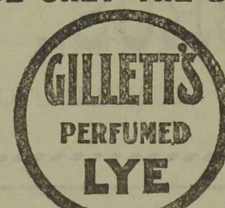

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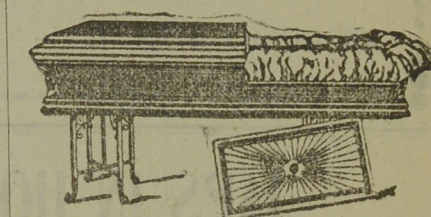
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
