TATTOOING AND ITS PRICE

It Involves Terrible Torture of the Body.

A Greek Who Was the Most Tattooed Man Known to History.

In Samoa tattooing is applied to the whole body from the hips to the knees, covering the skin so completely with the pattern that a little distance the person looks as though he were wearing ornamented tights, says The Chicago Daily News. The operation, which requires much time and many "sittings," is quite a ceremonious. The tattooer, called the matai, is a man of considerable influence, and his services are engaged by a prepayment of several mats, or perhaps a canoe. "Combs" are used and also a little mallet. The combs are made of human bones, about an inch or less in width, resembling little bone adzes with the edges cut with a number of teeth. These blades are attached to handles about six inches long. The pigment is made from the ashes of the cocoanut. The person to be tattooed lies on his face resting his head in the lap of his sister or some other female relative who, with other young women assisting, sings loudly to drown his groans, as it would injure his record for courage to be heard giving vent to expressions of pain. Instances have occurred however, when young braves have lost all self-control, being entirely overcome with the agony of the operation, and have been despised as cowards for the rest of their lives. The operator, having traced out his pattern, commences to drive the toothed "comb" through his skin with his mallet by sharp and rapid taps. The assistants are ready with strips of white "masi" to clean off the blood as it flows from the wounds.

A remarkable case of tattooing came to light in Professor Hebra's lecture room in a hospital in Vienna thirty years ago. The man was the subject of a lecture, and one of the spectators at first mistook him for a bronze statue. He was tattooed from head to foot, and not a quarter of a square inch of his entire person was intact. The skin presented an appearance resembling the tracery of an exceedingly rich cashmere shawl. The coloring was done with indigo principally, with enough red inserted here and there to give it an effect. His name was George Constantine, a Greek by birth, who, with a band of robbers, entered Chinese Tartary to commit depredations. The gang was captured and this man, with the others, was ordered by the ruler to be branded in this manner. On the palms of his hands letters were tattooed which explained that he was the greatest rascal and thief in the world. It took three months to tattoo him, the indigo being pricked into the skin. The designs represented elephants, lions, tigers and birds, with letters worked in between. A couple of dragons ornamented his forehead. He said his body swelled up very much at the time and ever since had been sensitive to changes in the weather.

AN INDIAN SHOOTING.

Tragic Love Story of Daniel Wataboo.

Victoria, Feb. 15.—When the steamer Tees left Port Eslington for Victoria, Daniel Wataboo, a native Kitkatla Indian, was lying in a critical condition in the hospital of that village as a result of an attempt to take his life. Wataboo, it seems, is suspected of witchcraft, and his

only failing is said to be the desire to become possessed of the heart and hand of one of the dusky Klootchmans of the Kitkatla reserve. He was about to visit the place on Tuesday last when nearly all the tribe were away. As he neared the shore in a canoe several shots were fired at him by would-be murderers secreted behind bushes. One bullet passed through Wataboo's body, but he managed to make the shore and reach the house of Rev. Mr. Gurd, Church of England missionary.

Daniel Wataboo is a man about fifty years of age, who by industry and thrift has become possessed of considerable wealth. The Indian woman whom he loves does not reciprocate his amorous ardor, and to influence her Daniel is accused of having practised witchcraft. At the time of the shooting he had been out in a canoe peering into his death box and muttering incantations according to Indian ideas. The tall passed through his abdomen, and it is doubtful if he will recover.

Noah's Ark.

It was on Nov. 16, B. C. 2348, that Noah and the animals came out of the ark, according to Archbishop Ussher's chronology. Several experts have calculated that they had enjoyed ample accommodation in the ark. Sir Walter Raleigh computed that there were eighty-nine distinct species of beasts to be provided for, "or, lest any should be omitted, a hundred several kinds." He allowed that one elephant would want as much space as four beeves and one lion as two wolves, and found that there was room for 91, or, say, 120 beeves, 80 sheep and 64 wolves, which sufficed. One story or room would hold these, another their meat, a third the birds and their food, and still there was space for Noah and his family.

How Fulgurites Form.

A fulgurite is formed by a bolt of lightning. A geologist gives this explanation: "When a bolt of lightning strikes a bed of sand it plunges downward into the sand for a distance less or greater, transforming simultaneously into glass the silica in the material through which it passes. Thus by its great heat it forms at once a glass tube of precisely its own size. Now and then such a tube is found and dug up. Fulgurites have been followed into the sand by excavations for nearly thirty feet. They vary in interior diameter from the size of a quill to three inches or more, according to the bore of the flash."

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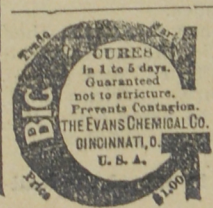
