GREAT FUNERAL.

Toronto Citizens Paid Last Tribute to Late E. F. Clarke, M. P.

BUSINESS IN THE CITY GENERALLY SUSPENDED.

Over 10,000 Persons Called at Residence of Deceased.

Toronto, March 7.—The citizens of Toronto and suburbs turned out in thousands yesterday afternoon to pay a final tribute of respect to the memory of the late Mr. E. F. Clarke, M.P. The streets along which the long cortege moved were lined with sympathetic and sorrowing people, and during the funeral hour thousands of flags rested at half-mast, bells tolled, and business was practically suspended.

At noon a private service was held at the family residence, 383 Markham street, and at one o'clock the remains were removed to Broadway Methodist Tabernacle, where for two hours a steady stream of people passed by the casket, taking a final view of the deceased. Precisely at three o'clock, the public service was commenced by Rev. Mr. Orman, pastor of the Emmanuel Reformed Episcopal church, who was assisted by Rev. Dr. Potts and other clergymen in that part of the city. The church would accommodate only a fragment of the enormous crowd that sought admission. The funeral was in charge of representatives of the city council and every civic respect was paid to the remains of the departed.

The honorary pall bearers were members of the city council, namely: Mayor Urquhart, ex-Mayors Boswell, Flemming, McMurrich and Shaw, and the Toronto colleagues of deceased in the House of Commons, A. E. Kemp, Hon. George E. Foster, E. B. Osler and A. Claude MacDonnell.

The order of the procession was as follows: Mounted police, County Orange lodge on foot and other societies walking, clergy, honorary bearers, active bearers, carriages with flowers, hearse, representatives of the Governor-General, the Senate and House of Commons, the Lieutenant-Governor and the Local Legislature, City Council, civic officials, Board of Education, officials of Christ Church, fraternal societies in carriages, citizens in carriages.

It is estimated that upwards of ten thousand people called at the family residence yesterday between ten o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock at night to offer sympathy

to Mrs. Clarke and family, deposit a spray or wreath on the casket or take a last look at the remains. Laborers, mechanics letter carriers, clerks, merchants and members of Parliament called. From every rank in trade or calling came men and women who respected "The People's Ned" as he was familiarly and properly called. The Catholic Church was represented by Rev. Fathers Rohleder and Minahan, who called to express the sympathy of the clergy of that denomination.

A greater profusion of flowers was never seen in a house of mourning in Toronto. In the large parlor where the remains lay, floral tributes were banked up on every side, and another room was necessary to provide space for the many wreaths, anchors, pillar and other designs of great floral beauty. Perhaps the wreath most precious to the bereaved family was that which came from the playmates of Mr. Clarke's children.

VOLCANO AGAIN ACTIVE.

Slumbered Peacefully for Twenty-five Years.

New York, March 7.—The Herald publishes the following mail communication from Managua, dated Feb. 2:—Quiescent for the last twenty-five years, Momotombo, the great Nicaraguan volcano, has begun become active. On Jan. 17 a sudden eruption took place at eleven thirty o'clock in the morning with a discharge of lava, rocks and volcanic ashes. The ashes were carried a distance of one hundred and fifty miles, and severe earthquake shocks were felt in Costa Rica and Honduras. A great amount of live stock on the surrounding haciendas were killed, but no human lives were lost as far as is known. Subterranean noises were plainly heard for more than a hundred miles.

Momotombo, on the northwest shore of Lake Nicaragua, is thirty miles in the interior from Corinto. The mountain is a shapely conical peak four thousand miles high, the loftiest of its range. For a year past smoke has been issuing from its peak, signifying that at any time the volcano might renew its activity.

Premier Balfour announced in the house of commons Monday that Mr. Wyndham, the chief secretary for Ireland had resigned. This had been expected for some time, as the unionist members from Ireland have been vigorously assailing Mr. Wyndham. He had filled the office for over four years.
