

AWAKE, RUSSIA! FEAR GOD!

Remarkable Pastoral Address, Arraigning the People

DISASTERS OF THE COUNTRY A JUST PUNISHMENT FOR THEIR FRIVOLITY, DISSIPATION AND IMPIETY.

St. Petersburg, March 21.—Metropolitan Antonius has issued a remarkable pastoral address arraigning the Russia of today for vanity, frivolity, dissipation and impiety, the just punishment of which is humiliation of the nation, and preaching repentance and the fear of God.

"It is not the first time," the pastoral says, "that on holy Russia has fallen dire misfortune, but then Russia was a totally different country, strong in the hope of the holy religion, and impregnable in devotion to the Emperor and the fatherland. Now, while carrying on a great war, instead of congregating in a spirit of high and self-denying patriotism, in-

ternal dissensions reign in the land, everything is overthrown, science is neglected, and what is holy is trampled upon.

"During the carnival days last week, while our heroes were dying in unequal combat, watering the battlefields with their blood, we dared even then abandon ourselves to the usual excesses, days of feasting and unseemly dissipation. With right we are despised by all, mocked at by the peoples of the earth. Awake then, holy, orthodox Russia; fear God, cleanse thyself from the stain of the foulness of thy sins. Repent, enlighten thyself, and God will give thee grace."

HUMAN RACE IS DOOMED.

But Not For Ten Million Years, or so Yet.

Chicago, March 21.—Prof. Samuel W. Williston of the University of Chicago told his students in paleontology that the human race is doomed to annihilation, but he added that they need not worry about it this spring. It would be ten million years or so before the worst came, the professor promised.

"The fishes, amphibians, reptiles and mammals have in turn been created, and have been the dominant types of the earth," said Professor Williston. "Each has become too highly specialized, and consequently has become extinct, while the next has risen to the highest point of ascendancy. Man is already too highly specialized, and cannot change into another form. Consequently he will also become extinct, as have the preceding types."

His resignation, written Wednesday, was filed in the office of the Secretary of State at 4:20 p. m. Thus, in a space of less than 21 hours, Colorado has had three Governors. It is said McDonald reluctantly takes the chair.

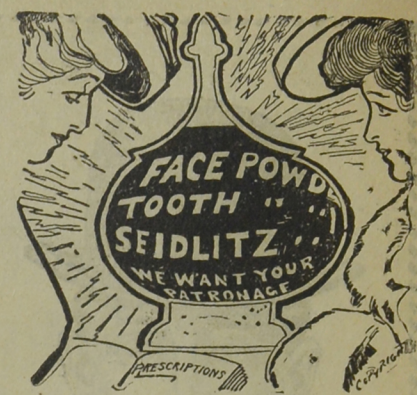

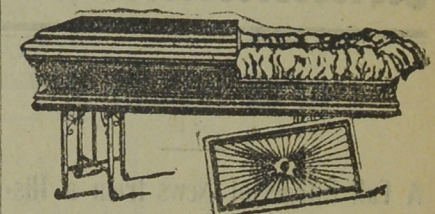

AUTOMOBILE BILL.

H. G. Chestnut and G. J. Parrett Make Suggestions to the Municipalities Committee.

SLUG TWO

The Automobile Bill was before the Municipalities Committee of the Legislature Tuesday morning and most of its sections were passed. Messrs. H. G. Chestnut and George J. Parrett represented the Auto-interest and addressed the committee several times, making a number of suggestions. Motor bicycles and tricycles were excluded from the operations of the bill. The speed of the auto in the thickly settled parts of the city was limited to a mile in eight minutes.

Mr. Chestnut objected to the speed on a bridge being limited to four miles an hour, but this stands for the present. Mr. Copp objected to the last section, which authorized the payment to the secretary of the Board of Works of a reasonable remuneration for his services as licensing officer, on the ground that the amount should be fixed by the legislature.

Provision was made for the cancellation of the license of a Chauffeur after the third offence. The bill will be further considered by the committee on Thursday.

There was a large crowd in attendance and the proceedings were followed with interest.

Mr. Lowell, the new member for St. John county, is most active in support of the bill. He expressed his opinion of automobiles in rather forcible terms. He thought a man who could afford to spend \$2,000 for an auto need not be in a hurry to get over a bridge or through the streets of a city. He certainly was not deserving of any more privileges than other citizens.

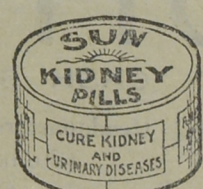
