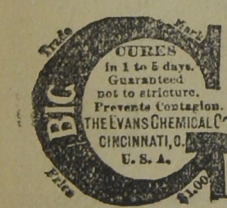

FOUGHT ON EDGE OF SKY-SCRAPER.

Two Workmen had an Encounter on Narrow Planking Eighty Feet Above Yonge Street—Thrilling Sight for Onlookers.

Toronto News:—Eighty feet above the pavement of Yonge street, with only a narrow plank to bear them up, two of the workmen engaged on the Traders' Bank building had a set-to at the close of the dinner-hour a couple of days ago. For five minutes they swayed one way and the other on the edge of the girder forming the Yonge street front of the eighth storey, while those below who were able to see them expected every moment that they would pitch to the street and be dashed to pieces.

A THRILLING SIGHT.

From the windows of some of the high buildings throughout the tussle could be more plainly seen than from the street, and those who witnessed it describe it as a thrilling sight, whether the men were in earnest or were only indulging in a little horse-talk. A half-dozen of their fellows stood above on the staging or clung to the upright posts, watching the struggle without making any short to stop it. As soon as the foreman caught sight of what was going on he went up and put a stop to it.

STRUCK WITH A BAR.

Before he got there, however, one of the men had struck the other on the side of the head with what looked to be a short bar of iron, but, fortunately, not so, as to knock him outward.

Familiarity with the dangers of working astride of a narrow girder high up in the air makes these men careless, and in this case the two combatants probably felt as much at home as the ordinary person would on the ground. But to the onlooker the sight of two men struggling on the edge of such a descent was one to make the heart stand still.
