POSTPONED UNTIL NEXT YEAR.

City Council Will Not Seek Passage of Bonus Act This Session.

Mayor McNally's long looked for inaugural address was presented to the city council at an official meeting called for the purpose yesterday afternoon. It took His Worship fifteen minutes to read the document, and when he concluded there was an awkward silence, which was finally broken by Ald. Barbour moving that it be referred to all the committees of the council. As there was no precedents to go by, Ald. Barbour's motion seemed to strike the aldermen about right, and they all supported it.

Those present at the meeting besides His Worship were: Alds. Mitchell, Everett, Ross, Hawthorn, Randolph, Chestnut, Barbour, McKenzie, and Stockford.

The spectators present were: Roadmaster McKay, Police Magistrate Marsh, Alex. Burchill, E. W. Henry, City Treasurer Golding, and F. Wayland Porter.

The full text of the mayor's inaugural has already been published in these columns.

Ald. Barbour complimented the mayor on the excellence of his address. He thought His Worship had laid down an extensive programme, and he felt sure that the chairmen of the several departments would do their duty towards carrying out the suggestions. In regard to the water department he could promise that the committee were giving the question of improving the water supply very careful consideration, and looked for results that would be satisfactory to all. He moved that the mayor's address be recommended to the favorable consideration of the several committees.

Ald. Chestnut seconded the motion and it was unanimously adopted. The mayor stated that the question of a bonus bill presented to the last regular meeting, but for some reason it was overlooked. The present meeting had been called to deal with that matter.

THE AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE.

Discussed Wheat Raising, Stock Importation, etc.,—Supt. Mitchell Defends His Course.

The agricultural committee held a meeting yesterday attended by Commissioner Farris, Deputy Peters, Hon.

The question of the bonus to four mills was fully discussed.

Deputy Peters stated that the department had already acted upon the suggestion of the committee, and incorporated in the bond taken that mills getting government bonus shall be operated for at least ten years.

The question of tolls was discussed and the opinion expressed that the department should exercise some supervision in that respect. Also that the department should receive from the millers a return showing the number of bushels of grain, the percentage of chaff and foul seed, and the output of flour.

Deputy Peters stated that about 100,000 barrels of flour are produced in New Brunswick each year.

Commissioner of Agriculture Farris stated that it was not the intention of the department to make an importation of horses and cattle this year. The department is urging the Agricultural Societies to put their government grant into purchasing pure bred stock, and during the last three years \$37,000 has been spent by the societies in this way. Private parties are also importing horses and stock, one importation of horses and two of stock having been made last year. There is also an auction sale of fine bred cattle at the Amherst winter fair, patronized by the New Brunswick farmers.

Dairy Superintendent Mitchell addressed the committee upon his work and defended himself against criticisms made in the House this session. He commended highly the cold storage plant at Sussex and thought it should receive a government bonus. He also spoke of the creamery in St. John City operated by W. H. Bell, and thought that enterprise worthy of a government grant for which he had applied.

Dairy Superintendent Tilley spoke along the same lines, as also did Mr. Daigle.

The committee will meet again Monday morning.
