FIRST NOTARY TO GO.

Chas. Champion Enjoys Unusual Distinction.

London, Feb. 20.—The first notary public ever struck off the roll in England, as far as the records show, has been removed by Sir Lewis T. Dibdin, sitting as Master of the Faculties in the Upper House of Convocation at Church House, Westminster.

The man who possesses this doubtful distinction is Mr. Charles Goble Champion, formerly a solicitor, whose name was recently removed from the roll of solicitors because of complaints concerning the funds of a certain estate.

The application for his removal from the roll of notaries was made by the Provincial Society of Notaries Public, and a curious question of jurisdiction was raised.

The court, it was explained, was an ancient one, established by Henry VIII. to exercise on behalf of the Archbishop of Canterbury certain jurisdiction which up to that time had belonged to the Pope.

The notarial office was formerly under the control of the See of Rome, and while there was no record of the Pope ever having removed a notary, there could be no doubt that he had the power to do so. There was similarly no record of the Court of Faculties ever having removed a notary, but Sir Lewis declared that there could be no doubt that the Pope's power of removal descended to it.

Mr. Champion pleaded that he had already been punished for whatever offence he had committed by being struck off the solicitors' roll, and declared that his practice as a notary had been clean and honest.

The Master of Faculties, however, decided that it was necessary that holders of the notarial office should be above suspicion, and directed that his name be struck off the roll.

ALBANI SALE MONEY.

The Sale of Albani Tickets Will Begin Monday Morning at McMurray's.

No Orders for Tickets Taken Unless Accompanied by Cash.

CUT A PRIEST'S THROAT.

Pastor St. John's Church, Freeland, Pa., in Serious State.

Wilkesbarre, Pa., Feb. 20.—Rev. Chas. Paldue, pastor of St. John's Slavonian Catholic Church, at Freeland, near here, was attacked last night by an unknown assailant, who cut the priest's throat and struck him on the head. The priest went to the front door to answer the bell, his servants being absent. A man stepped inside the vestibule and immediately plunged a knife into his neck. A second slash was made at the throat, cutting it from the other side, and the assailant struck him a heavy blow on the forehead, making a deep wound. The priest managed to climb the stairs to his room, where he was found unconscious. The intense excitement among the parishioners causes the authorities to fear a lynching will be attempted if the assailant is caught. The police express the belief that the attack was the result of a "Black Hand" plot.
