

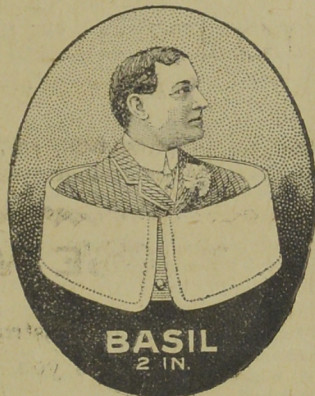

THE PEOPLE'S BANK.

Fredericton's Substantial Financial Institution Had Another Prosperous Year. Annual Statement, List of Shareholders.

The annual meeting of the Stockholders of the People's Bank of New Brunswick was held this afternoon when Manager Spurden submitted a very satisfactory statement of the past year's business.

Besides paying a dividend of 8 per cent amounting to \$14,400, \$5,000 has been added to the rest account which now reaches \$180,000. \$3,500 was transferred to the sinking fund and a balance of \$8,443.26 is carried forward. A total net profit for the year was \$23,272.22.
