CHRIST'S SAYINGS

New Verse of St. Mark's Gospel Unearthed

CHICAGO, ILL., Dec. 21.—The Daily News yesterday says: "A new saying of Christ, lost to the world for thirteen centuries and found in Egypt, was given to the world for the first time yesterday by Professor Henry A. Sanders, of the University of Michigan, in addressing the members of the Archaeological Institute now in session at the University of Chicago. The fragment is part of an old Bible dating back to the Moslem conquest of Egypt, and on its face is so authentic as to disarm hostile criticism."

The long lost fragment belongs in the sixteenth chapter of the gospel of St. Mark, and follows the fourteenth verse. It relates to the story of Christ's appearance, following His death, to eleven of his apostles in Jerusalem. "With the new verse in, the Bible reads:

"Mark xvi., 14: They answered saying that this age of unrighteousness and unbelief is under the power of Satan, who does not permit the things which are made impure by (evil) spirits to comprehend the truth of God and His power. For this reason 'reveal thy righteousness now,' they said to Christ; and Christ said to them: 'The limit of the years of the power of Satan has been fulfilled, but other terrible things are at hand and I was delivered unto death on behalf of those who sinned in order that they may return to the truth and sin no more to the end that they may inherit the spiritual, indestructible glory of righteousness which is in Heaven.'"

ADDRESS AND PURSE

Harvey Presbyterians Honor their Departing Pastor

HARVEY STATION, Dec. 30.—The annual congregational meeting of the Presbyterian church was held on Friday last. J. H. Grieve occupied the chair, and considerable interest was taken in the proceedings. The report of the secretary-treasurer showed the congregation to be in a good condition financially. The following board of management was elected for the ensuing year: Alex. Burrell, G. H. Coburn, A. Dorcas, Jas. T. Swan, Geo. Swan, Robt. Moffatt, Chas. Little, Geo. Gleghorn and M. Gass. J. W. Taylor was re-elected secretary-treasurer and S. B. Hunter and John H. Grieve, auditors.

Before the close of the meeting Rev. Jas. A. McLean, who is to sever his connection with the congregation on Tuesday next, was presented with an address signed by the elders, and expressing regret at parting with him, and mentioning some of the good work done by him during his pastorate here, and telling of the high esteem in which he is held by the congregation. The address was accompanied by a purse of \$50 in gold. Mr. McLean replied thanking the people for their kindness done him, and referred to the cordial relations that had always existed between himself and his people. Mr. McLean preached his farewell sermon yesterday. The attendance was large. The congregation felt that in parting with Mr. McLean they are sustaining a heavy loss. For nearly twenty-two years he has labored here faithfully and well, and had the high esteem of all classes. He is to be inducted to the charge of the congregation at Mahone Bay, N. S., on Thursday next.

LIBERAL CONVENTION

Friends of the Government in Carleton will Select Successor to Mr. McCain

WOODSTOCK, Dec. 31.—The Liberals of the county of Carleton will hold a convention in Graham's Opera house on Saturday afternoon at half-past two, for the purpose of nominating a candidate for the House of Assembly, to take the place of Andrew D. McCain, who was obliged to retire from the ticket on account of ill-health. The delegates from the northern part of the county will be taken home by a special train, which will leave Woodstock in the evening, after the convention.

The supporters of the government in Carleton are in excellent spirits, and confident of success when the fight comes.

The other two government candidates are Solicitor General Jones and Harry Carroll. Among those who will be present and speak at the convention will be Premier Robinson, Solicitor General Jones, and Frank B. Carvell, M. P.

LIBERAL VICTORY

Government Candidate in Nicolet Elected by 500 Majority

MONTREAL, P. Q., December 31.—In the bye-election for the Nicolet seat in the house of commons yesterday, Dr. Turcotte, Liberal, was elected by a majority of 500, over J. R. Hoen, Conservative. The seat was vacated by the appointment of Mr. Chas. Devlin, Liberal, to a place on the Quebec cabinet.

LOST HIS HOME

HARTLAND, N. B., Dec. 31.—Sunday evening fire destroyed the barn and dwelling of George Crandall at Avoirdale. Although the family had not retired, the flames were enveloping the outside of the building before the fire was known to them. Nothing of the household goods and very little of the stock was saved. The loss was about \$4,000 worth, and \$1,000 insurance.

KILLED IN EXPLOSION

FIELD, B. C., Dec. 31.—(Special)—Three muckers, named Marritt, Paulo and J. Duffy were blown up and killed in an accidental explosion of dynamite in Macdonnell and Gzowski grading contract here. The explosion was due to stray pieces that had got mixed with dirt.

A LONG WALK IN WINTER.

Pitiful Plight of English Immigrants At New Liskeard.

NEW LISKEARD, Ontario, December 31.—About 80 English immigrants out of employment and with no money started to walk from Macdonnell's Chutes, 100 miles north of here, to Toronto. The distance is about 480 miles. Three of them had their feet so badly frozen that they had to be carried as far as Englehart and then brought to the hospital here. They are lying here now in a pitiful condition. They all tell of hard usage which they say they received at the hands of some of the contractors of the railway line north of here. There are a number of men coming into this country without situations, and as a result they can get no work here and are left destitute. Some of the immigrants referred to above obtained enough money to take them to Toronto, but the great majority of them are on the march.
