

MIRACULOUS CURE AT STE. ANNE BE BEAUPRE SHRINE

Contractor David Gunn Who Came in Pilgrimage from
Albany Recovers from Paralysis, Chronic

Montreal Herald: There arrived at Place Viger Station this morning by the C. P. R. train from Quebec, a man according to his own positive declaration, has experienced about the most remarkable physical and mental transformation that has fallen to the lot of man since the days of miracles.
