KILLED ON THE TRACK

Patent Medicine Seller run over while Asleep on the I. C. R.

Cornelius Van Diemen, of Kansas City, was killed on the I. C. R. about two miles on the St. John side of Coldbrook, by No. 6 express from Moncton and Truro last evening. As near as can be ascertained the unfortunate man was lying between the rails when the train thundered along. He was dragged along the roadbed beneath the locomotive for nearly seven car lengths before the train was stopped.

On Saturday Cornelius and Benjamin Van Diemen, brothers, came to St. John and have been selling patent medicine. It was the brother who identified the dead man. He said that since 11 o'clock in the morning he had been searching for his brother. He asked to be allowed to see the body, but was told to wait until the undertaker arrived and the body was transferred to the dead house; but about 11:30 o'clock, when the undertaker came he was allowed to see the body and at once identified it as that of his brother. He broke down utterly and wept like a child. "What am I to do now?" he said. "There were just two of us, and we were always together. I little thought that when we parted this morning after a little disagreement, that I would see him like this. We came here on Saturday and have done very little work, though our business is selling patent medicine."

"We were drinking together this morning about 10 o'clock, and had a little trouble, but nothing very much. I have been looking for him tonight, and when I heard about this accident I came here, for I was afraid it was he."

The bereaved brother said his parents were dead, and there were no other members of the family; no one to tell of the accident.

ST. JOHN, N. B., November 19.—(Special).—Coroner Berryman is not satisfied with the explanation of the death of Cornelius Van Diemen, on the I. C. R. near Coldbrook last night.

Van Diemen was asleep on the tracks and was instantly killed by a train. Coroner Berryman is enquiring into the case and will probably hold an inquest.

BIG NAVAL PROGRAM

BERLIN, Nov. 10.—The imperial navy estimates provide for the outlay in 1918 of \$85,000,000, which is \$15,000,000 more than in 1917. There will be a progressive increase in the estimates, until in 1912 they will reach \$97,500,000. During the next four years Germany will lay down annually three battleships as large as the British Dreadnought and a huge armored cruiser similar to the 19,000-ton ship now building at Hamburg.

It is figured that Germany will have 1919 38 first class battleships, of which 24 will be of the Dreadnought class, and eight of the 19,000-ton cruisers. Each battleship and cruiser will cost \$9,125,000. This high price is largely due to the armament, which will be immensely strong.

The present estimate allots \$1,750,000 for submarines, and this amount will be the future annual outlay on boats of this type. There will be 12 new torpedo boat destroyers built each year. There will be an increase in every branch of naval construction and defence work.

Meanwhile the Prussian army estimates have been increased \$1,800,000, besides extraordinary expenditures of \$7,600,000 to improve fortifications. The estimates of the interior contain the sum of \$535,000 for improving Count Zepherin's airship, and \$35,000,000 for widening the Kaiser Wilhelm canal.
