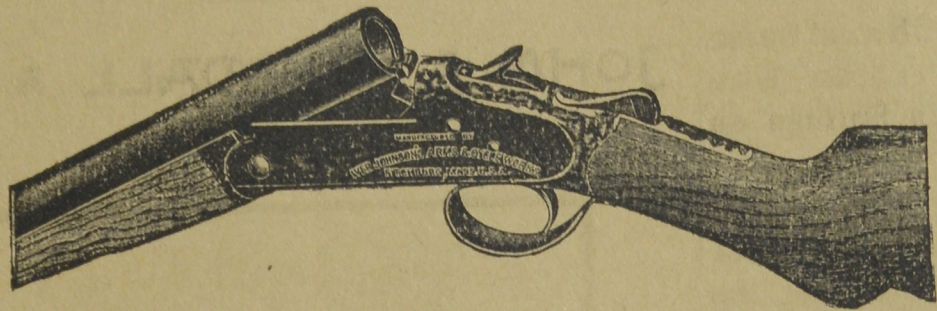

## CANADIAN IMMIGRATION

Over a Quarter of a Million New Settlers in Canada for Year Ending June 30

OTTAWA, Aug. 18.—Canada's yearly immigration has passed the quarter million mark. In seven years it has increased 1,000 per cent. The total immigration to Canada for the twelve months ended June 30, 1907, reached 252,038. For the twelve months ended June 30, 1906, it was 189,064, a gain of 62,974, or 33 per cent. Via ocean ports, the number was 859, compared with 23,604 during the 1905-06 season, a gain of 835,355, or 352 per cent. From the United States the number was 56,518, as compared with 57,796, for the preceding year, a loss of 1,278 or 2 per cent. For April, May and June, the first quarter of the present fiscal year, the immigration via ocean ports was 105,512, compared with 73,431 last year, an increase of 32,081 or 44 per cent. From the United States, it was 21,512, compared with 23,604 during the corresponding period last year, a decrease of 2,092 or 11 per cent.

### THE KING'S WHISKEY.

Had To Be Taken Straight At Ischl.

ISCHL, Austria, August 16.—After the meeting of King Edward and the Emperor Francis Joseph, today, Sir Charles Hardinge and the Austrian Foreign Minister had a conversation at which the Macedonian question was discussed and perfect concord attained between the two governments as regards the measures to be taken against Macedonian bands. The agreement between Britain and Austria is the more propitious, as all the other powers will fall in line with it. A communication to this effect will be issued by the Vienna Foreign Office.

A laughable story is current here relative to the King. For weeks great preparations for the royal visit had been making at the Hotel Elizabeth and a stock of everything it was conceived possible King Edward might want was laid in. Almost immediately after his arrival the King asked for soda water

### HORSEFLESH FOR FOOD.

A Chicago Buyer Inquiring in Montreal.

MONTREAL, Que., Aug. 17.—Mr. F. A. Hart, of Chicago, has called upon Dr. Laberge, medical health officer, in regard to the slaughter of horses for human consumption. It was desired to purchase horses in Montreal and ship them to Chicago, where they could be turned into human food. The stranger was referred to several horse dealers in this city, but as the prices of horses are high in Montreal it is not thought much business will be done here. Dr. Laberge was asked if he thought the trade in horse meat would be successful in Montreal. His reply was that the public would have to be educated to like the meat, which, it appears, is much appreciated in Paris and other cities.

### NEGROES DISFRANCHISED.

Georgia Legislature Takes Ballot From the Black Man.

ATLANTA, Ga., August 17.—By a vote of 159 to 16, the house yesterday passed the negro disfranchisement bill which was previously adopted by the senate.

The lower branch of the legislature made a few minor additions to this, concurred in by the Senate.

The Declaration of Independence stated: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

The 15th amendment to the U. S. constitution, ratified by Georgia, declares:

"The right of the citizens of the United States shall not be denied or abridged by the United States, on account of race, color, or previous condition of servitude."

In Georgia there are 1,181,000 whites and 1,034,813 negroes.

Peel the fruit—peaches or pears—weight them, and, to every pound of fruit allow a half-pound of sugar. Place the fruit and sugar in alternate layers in a preserving kettle, bring slowly to the boil, and, for six pounds of fruit, allow a pint of vinegar spiced with a tablespoonful each of ground mace, cinnamon and cloves, each of these spices being tied into a small muslin bag. Pour the vinegar over the fruit and boil for five minutes. At the end of this time remove the fruit, spread it on platters, and boil the syrup until thick, then pack the fruit into glass jars, fill to overflowing with the syrup (from which the spice bags have been removed) and seal.
