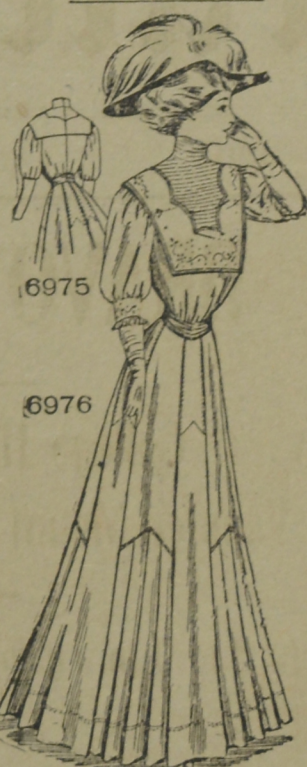

A CHARMING DEVELOPMENT IN BROADCLOTH.

The new materials afford a wide range of selection to the woman of taste, and the latest costumes have been designed with a view to their artistic development. The costume sketched is modelled in one of the fashionable broadcloths, with garnitures of embroidery and soutache braid, though it would make up equally well in any soft wool fabric. The waist (6975) owes its chief distinction to the wide square bertha which extends over the shoulders in a peculiarly smart effect and at its scalloped upper edge is adjusted over a removable chemisette. The skirt (6976) is a nine gored model, showing a box-pleat effect at the front, back and sides and having the side-gores lengthened by side-pleated sections. The result is a becoming slenderness at the hips combined with a stylish flare at the hem. To develop this costume in the medium size will demand 2 1/2 yards of 44 inch goods for the waist and 5 1/2 yards of the same width for the skirt.

BOWLING.

SENSATIONAL WORK.

Brooklyn, Oct. 28.—The Newark Eastern League team rolled in sensational form throughout the afternoon and evening on the Tuxedo alleys in Newark yesterday and defeated Brooklyn eight out of fourteen games.

The work of Johnny Voorheis against Weingarth in the individuals saved Brooklyn a crushing defeat. Weingarth was hardly dangerous when the "Little Wizard" rolled 21, 237, 195, 249 and 247, winning all five games. The two-men contests were the most sensational. Nelson and Voorheis totaled 458, 405 and 425 and lost all three. Beilly Weingarth hit the pins for a 277 score in the first game, while Johns was on hand with 237, making a total of 514, the highest two-men score ever rolled in the Eastern League. The Newarkers tallied 417 and 459 in the last two.

Weingarth did not bowl for the three-men series, but Charley Meyer and Eddie Pierson were as much on the job with Johns at anchor as was Weingarth. Pierson rolled evenly and well, but Meyer was a double-century roller every time, while Johns was even better. The team totals were 632, 635 and 610. Voorheis kept up the same kind of work but it was of no avail against the fast going Jerseyman.

After the first game in the five-men series, which resulted in Brooklyn's favor, 945 to 918, it looked as though the visitors might have a chance to at least annex one more series; but Weingarth, Sohns and Meyer renewed their fast pace and the home outfit totaled 999 in the second, the visitors rolling a discouraging 885. The Brooklyn lads improved in the final, but Pierson got on the job with the others and contributed 224, Meyer making 236, Johns 222, Hoagland 186 and Weingarth 220, for a team of 1,088. The opposing total was 911.

Such a streak of sensational bowling, maintained throughout an entire series, has seldom, if ever, been seen either on local alleys or on those in this vicinity. Barring the individuals, in which Weingarth averaged 194, the team averages were far above the general 200 mark. In the two-men the winners figured 463 for the three games, 625 in the three men and 1,001 in the five men. To roll these totals it was necessary that each man bowl an average of 209. Voorheis made the remarkable average of 223 for the fourteen games, the best individual work of the day.

Man Suspected of Designs on His Majesty's Life.

NEWMARKET, ENG., Oct. 29.—The police here today arrested a man suspected of having designs on the life of King Edward or the Prince of Wales. The prisoner, who was a member of the Bechuanaland (South Africa) Police, named J. H. Pearce, was found wandering in Chippenham Park where the King had been shooting this week, and in which the Prince of Wales is going to shoot on Monday. Pearce when taken into custody said he intended to "shoot the

boss who was shooting here." After a preliminary examination in the police court he was remanded for further inquiries regarding his past life. It appears that he participated in the Jameson raid in the Transvaal, and is laboring under the impression that he has a grievance against King Edward, who left Newmarket yesterday and returned to London.

AYLESWORTH HOSPITAL

OTTAWA, Ont., October 29.—Hon. A. B. Aylesworth, who left on Friday afternoon for New York, has returned to Ottawa, and was back at business as usual yesterday morning.

The Minister of Justice, who is enjoying robust physical health, much encouraged by the hope held out to him by the New York specialist that his deafness can be considerably ameliorated, and will remain in Ottawa the whole of this week at least, performing his official duties. Next week he will go to Clifton Springs.

In reply to the many answers received from these a meeting was arranged at the cafe. 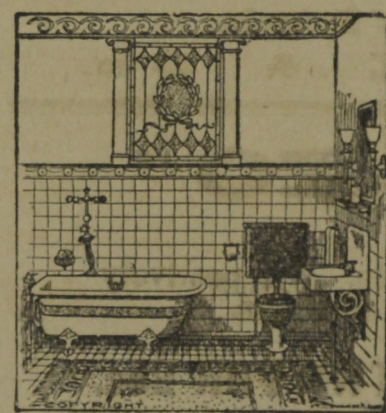
