PILLAGE AND MURDER

Moors and Arabs Took Horrible Revenge for Bombardment of Casa Blancas.

TANGIER, August 9.—Horrible details of the slaughter of Jews, the maltreating of women, and the pillage and burning of shops at Casablanca, and told by passengers who arrived here last night by steamer from that port.

After the bombardment began Moorish soldiers and Arabs revenged themselves on the inhabitants, plundering, killing and burning on all sides. They sacked the customs house, and burned a large part of the city, whose streets are filled with decomposing bodies that an epidemic is threatened. Among the Jews killed was a man under the British consulate. His sisters were assaulted and carried off by Moors.

Many feats of heroism by French and Spanish sailors are recounted.

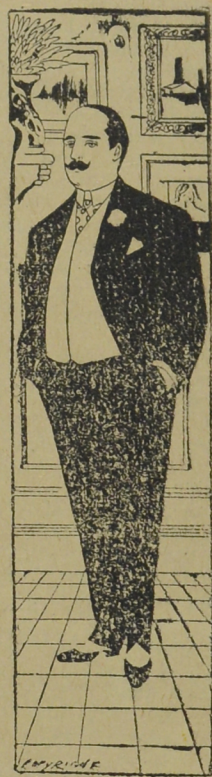
