

ADDRESS ON MISSIONS.

Mrs. Johnston Spoke of Her Experience in Turkey.

Mrs. Edward S. Johnston of Ottawa gave an address on the life and work of missionaries in Turkey, in the Methodist Church, Gibson last Sunday evening.

Mrs. Johnston was formerly a teacher in one of the schools under the American Mission board at Antioch. She explained briefly the mode of government in Turkey and under the Turks as being the worst on earth.

There are no roads, properly so considered, except goat paths.

An effort was made to introduce telephones and when the authorities heard Turkish spoken through them, they expressed surprise at the telephone learning their language in three weeks, the time it took to erect them. The authorities themselves would not attempt to speak through it.

The Armenians are only Christian in name, many of whom have never heard of Christ crucified and are totally ignorant of the gospel.

All Mohammedans who become Christians have to leave the country or suffer death. Educated girls bring a higher price in the matrimonial market. Boys and girls are not permitted to be educated together and each must have teachers of their own sex. 75 per cent of those who pass through mission schools become Christians. The description of the modes of life and the moral and spiritual condition was very graphic and deeply impressive closing with a soul stirring account of a massacre of the Christians and the fidelity to Christ of some of the converts.

The large audience sat in rapt attention throughout and universal appreciation was expressed of the fluent and eloquent addresses given by Mrs. Johnston who will always receive a welcome here.

Mr. and Mrs. Johnston accompanied by their son, Master Harry Graham, leave for their home in Ottawa next Friday.

ABANDONED VESSEL.

Mysterious Wreck Discovered in Bay of Fundy.

DIGBY, N. S., Sept. 10.—One of the most mysterious wrecks ever known on the Bay of Fundy coast was discovered at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon, three miles west of Gulliver's Cove, by the tug George L., which was bound from Digby to Weymouth. When the dense fog lifted, which had prevailed for several days, Captain Lewis, master of the tug, sighted right ahead on the rocks the American coaster with her foremast and two masts hoisted and masts furled. The captain immediately lowered a boat and boarded the strange craft, which proved to be the Decora of Machias, Maine. There was not a soul on board. The vessel was loaded with soft coal, her after hatch was open, her main hatch battened down. The boat had been cut from the davits, her compass torn from the binnacle and officers and crew had evidently taken a portion of their clothes, leaving nothing behind to show their names or whence the vessel had sailed or her port of destination. The tug returned to Digby last night and reported the wreck to the customs officers. Captain Lewis says the vessel must have been abandoned in moderate weather, for a pipe filled with tobacco was on the cabin table, also a month organ, and nothing appeared to be disturbed in the galley. Meat had been left frying in a pan on the stove. Somebody had evidently secured all the papers, letters, etc., so that it is impossible to learn the name of anybody who was on board. Charles, however, had not been taken, and it is doubtful if the vessel's boat was properly provisioned for a long cruise. Both anchors were on the bow when the vessel was discovered, and it is thought she had drifted ashore after she was abandoned. There has been no heavy weather to necessitate the shooting of sail.

CANCER HAUNTS HOUSES.

Startling Theory Advanced by Paris Physician.

NEWYORK, Sept. 10.—The

Sun has received the following cable despatch from Paris: The sanitary authorities of Paris have reached the conclusion that houses can be infested with cancer, and that rooms which patients have occupied will convey the disease long after the victims are dead. Observation seems to prove that in houses where a death from cancer has appeared the disease often breaks out again when occupied by other families. This fact has so often been noted that now a census has been taken to see about houses where cancer patients died during the last six months of 1906.

There are 1,062 houses on the list which will be watched to see if the new residents become affected with the disease. Already in twelve of the houses there have been two successive cases.

Dr. Arn and reports that in a village of only 400 inhabitants there were in the space of seven years eleven deaths from cancer, all practically occurring in the same block of houses. Three years later seventeen of these houses had sheltered patients. The doctor concluded that the houses were hotbeds of cancer germs, and that no amount of disinfecting would drive them away.

Dr. Fillassier makes a report of a house where during thirty years there were five deaths from cancer, all in different families. Dr. Lambrier mentions a farmhouse at Gasny where eight families lived at various times. Each family developed one or two cases of the disease.

The question as to whether cancer is hereditary is not to be attributed to the same cause. Interesting results are expected from the observation which is now going on.

STANLEY NEWS.

A house belonging to Thomas Hawks in Irish town was burnt to the ground on 5th inst. It was built by the late John Murray and was rented to William Cameron, section foreman on Dr. Moore's railroad. Mrs. Cameron was visiting her parents at McAdam and William Cameron made a fire in the morning to cook his breakfast and dry his clothes and in a few minutes the whole roof was in a blaze and burnt down. Some of his goods were saved.

Both government engineers have been here to look over Dr. Moore's railway and passed it as a good line built according to contract.

There are five new houses building on the north side of Stanley Bridge this summer. The first one is Geo. F. Dunham's, our sturdy druggist. It is two stories high and hip roof and will be a fine building when completed. The second one is Eldon Douglas'. It is two story high, hip roof and plate glass windows and will also be a very fine building. The third one is Thomas W. Currie's, two stories high, the next is Edward Harvey's and Joseph Blair's. Peter Keenan and Simon Freeman are also building new houses.

Stanley Douglas with a crew of men is going to begin sawing at his Cross Creek mill on the 9th Sept. The tinkers have arrived in Stanley with three wagons and seven horses and are camping on Mr. Elliot's flat opposite the station. They are making lots of tin ware and their ladies are selling lots of fine goods from house to house in the village.

The old school house is condemned by the board of education and so a new superior school house is going to be built at the cost of \$1,000.

FLOCKING TO QUEENS UNIVERSITY.

KINGSTON, Ont., Sept. 7.—Registrar G. Y. Chown reports that more applications than ever have been received from students about to enter Queen's University, and that the freshman class will likely be a record one. Last season there were nearly 1,200 students registered, and this season the number will be close to 1,350, including pedagogy students, who will likely number at least fifty.

NEW TOY RIVALS THE TEDDY BEAR.

Wooden Caricatures, Chiefly of Dogs, are the Fad Now in Paris.

LONDON, Sept. 10.—Caron D'Arche, the brilliant French caricaturist, has invented a toy which threatens to do for Europe what Teddy bears have done for America. Giving up pen and ink work by medical advice, D'Arche has devoted himself to carving wood caricatures, chiefly comic animals, whose charms lie in the grotesque humor in which each is made to stand up, colored in flat tints. Each bears the artist's signature. D'Arche made them first for his own amusement. Now there are forty men working in a factory turning out his designs in wood. They are intended for children, but Paris went mad over the artist's handiwork. No French society lady is fully equipped without a Caron D'Arche dog. A common sight in Paris is a fashionably-dressed dame, walking with a wooden poodle or bull dog under her arm. These toys have now reached London, where society people hitherto have remained more or less indifferent to the joys conferred by the possession of Teddy bears, as familiarized by visiting Americans, but they are captivated by the charms of Caron D'Arche's dogs the demand for which is such that all the fashionable stores keep large stocks. They are being used as bridge mascots, a lady placing the ugly thing on a table beside her to bring good luck. The present prices range from sixty cents to a dollar and twenty cents, but in view of the great popularity of the dogs among the wealthy people, D'Arche is preparing more elaborate designs, and the craze may yet be carried to the extent of studding the toys with gems.

ANOTHER OUTRAGE

Vancouver Rioters Set Fire to Japanese School House—Matter Brought to Premier's Attention

OTTAWA, Sept. 10 (Special).—Japanese Consul General Nosse received this morning the following telegram from Consul Morioka at Vancouver, B. C. "About 10.30 last night, Monday, the rioters set the Japanese primary school on fire, but the building was saved from destruction by the Japanese." I at once interviewed the mayor at the police station and made a demand for him to call out the militia when ever necessary. Consul General Nosse presented the telegram to Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

"All that I am doing," said Mr. Nosse, is to present to the Premier the information of the disturbances as it reached me. For the rest I leave it to the good sense of the British and Canadian governments who have always treated us fairly. I am satisfied that they will do so in future and that our people will have the protection of the Canadian law."
