SHY AT TROUSSEAU AND MOURNING, TOO.

NEW YORK, December 10.—A feminine inconsistency in the seven trunks brought into this country last Saturday by Miss Florence Todd, a member of an old New Orleans family, on the French liner La Provence, has occasioned the seizure of \$10,000 worth of gowns and other personal effects necessary to the comfort of a wealthy young woman.

Miss Todd brought in her baggage under the Foreign Resident Law, for, while avowedly a native of Louisiana, she has lived abroad for five years, while she studied music with Jean de Reszke in Paris. Her father, in company with another man is owner of the St. Charles Hotel in New Orleans, and her family is of the most exclusive in that city. She was entitled under the law to bring over all that was needed for her personal use.

Miss Todd is represented by a well known law firm, but no attempt was made to prevent the seizure.

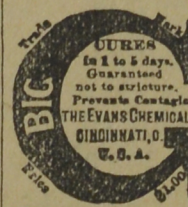
