VICTORIA HOSPITAL

New Plumbing and Modern Heating
Apparatus to be Introduced—Hurley and Shea Awarded Contracts

The trustees of Victoria Public Hospital held their monthly meeting last evening with Senator Thompson in the chair. The other gentlemen present were, Mr. Tennant, Mr. Kitchen, Dr. VanWart, Mr. Barry and the Secretary-treasurer.

Most of the time was consumed over the contracts for plumbing and heating the building.

It seems that the city engineer condemned the present ancient plumbing, as also did the practical men who have been repairing it for the past ten years.

The President declared that the time has arrived to stop repairs and have modern work introduced. The expense for the plumbing and heating as expressed by all the members is too great a drain upon the funds of the institution.

The contract for a new and up-to-date system of plumbing has been entered into with Mr. E. Hurley, and for improved hot water heating the contract was awarded to Mr. D. J. Shea.

The secretary-treasurer reported expenditures for July very large, but the receipts were correspondingly large.

The matron's report was very satisfactory showing thirty-four patients under treatment. One patient who owed a bill since 1899 paid it a few days ago.

Thanks were sent to secretary of Hiram Lodge, F. and A. M. for the sum of forty dollars contributed in the Parish Church on St. John's day, under the auspices of the lodge.

It is hoped the ambulance will be ready for service very soon. A new scale of fees is being arranged.

A joint meeting of medical staff and trustees will shortly be held.

After the transaction of other business the meeting adjourned.

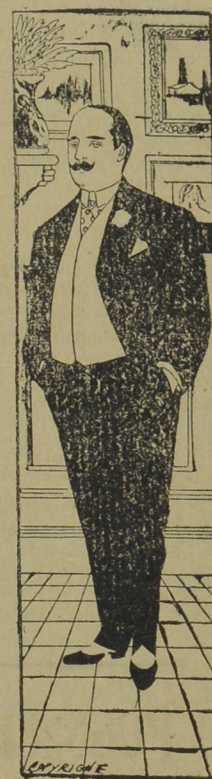
