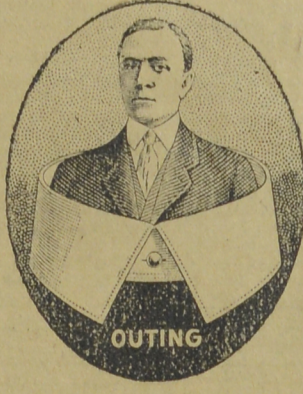

YORK CIRCUIT COURT

Seery vs. Federal Life Assurance Company
on for a Third Trial

The York Circuit court met at eleven o'clock this morning pursuant to adjournment, to try the now celebrated case of the executors of the late Dr. F. J. Seery vs. the Federal Life Assurance Company of Canada. Judge Landry is the presiding judge, and Mr. S. Dow Simmons is the official stenographer in attendance. Messrs. M. G. Teed, K. C., and Peter J. Hughes appear for the plaintiffs, and H. A. Powell, K. C., and R. B. Hanson for the defendant company.

SHIPPING NOTES.
