

HOME TO REST

Pathetic Arrival of Hon. Edward Blake at Toronto

Toronto News:—"I have come home to rest."

Hon. Edward Blake smiled somewhat languidly on the little group of friends and newspaper men who had gathered at Union Station to greet the return of the veteran statesman. He was "home," in the Province of which he was once Premier, in the Dominion wherein he had led one of the great political parties. For fifteen years he has been one of the notable figures of the Imperial Parliament, fighting the battles of the Isle of his birth, but Canada was evidently the abiding place of his heart. And he has "come home to rest" in the sunset of his career and in the affliction of the hour.

The veteran statesman was a pathetic figure this morning. His left side has not yet recovered from the paralytic stroke suffered and he was borne from the car by Station Superintendent Beed and his son, Mr. Samuel Blake, on a reclining chair. An occasional twinge passed over the leonine face, but ever and anon he smiled brightly in response to the hearty greeting of a friend.

The strong and striking figure of the past is somewhat shrunken, the lines upon the face have deepened, but the mouth is still firm and kindly, the hat was tilted back from the forehead as of yore and the same observant eyes gleamed through the spectacles.

For over an hour for the train was very late—Hon. Senator Kert, Mrs. (Prof.) Wrong, Mr. B. Croyn, and Dr. Croyn waited at the station. As the train slowly pulled in Mr. Blake was seen reclining in the private car "Alberta" and looking brightly from the window.

He saw his daughter and responded to Mrs. Wrong's waved greeting with a smile.

The little party entered the car and extended their welcome. But the statesman was anxious to reach home. There was no delay. Almost immediately he was removed from the car and carried down the platform to the waiting cab, and driven to his house on Jarvis street. He was accompanied on the journey by Mrs. Blake, his son, Mr. Samuel Blake, a nurse and male attendant.

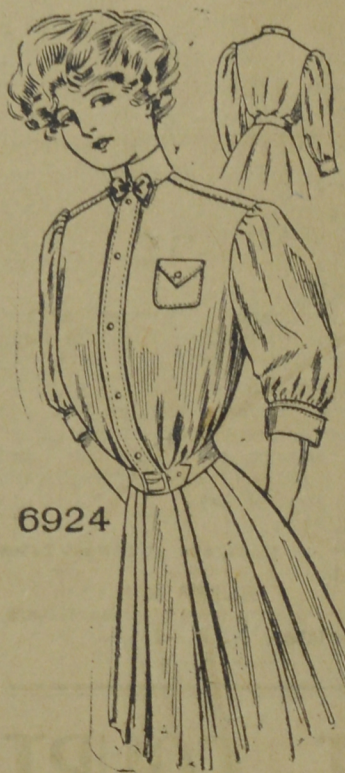
"Mr. Blake has thoroughly enjoyed the trip to Toronto," said his son to the News. "In Montreal he was somewhat fatigued with the heat, but he has rested well and is much more refreshed and brighter to-day. He bore the voyage splendidly and is in first class spirits."

"His mind is in no way impaired by his illness. He takes as keen an interest in everything as he always did. But he is going to rest—absolutely rest from political and public turmoil."

"We are quite expectant that the rest will restore him to his wonted health."

Hon. Mr. Blake traveled in the private car of Mr. J. W. Leonard, assistant general manager of the C. P. R., which was courteously placed at his disposal.

Speaking to the News the official in charge of the car said Mr. Blake had been bright and cheerful throughout the journey, particularly so as Toronto was neared. He had been looking forward to his return. He had slept splendidly and appeared to have a good appetite. In Montreal he had felt the severe heat but now seemed quite recovered.

DESERTING OLD ORCHARD

OLD ORCHARD ME., Aug. 19.—Every train out of Old Orchard yesterday carried away hundreds of summer guests made shelterless by Thursday night's fire, and last night the greater number had departed for their homes.

The number of deaths caused by the soda tank explosion during the fire was increased to two last night, when Phillip Perreault, died in that city.

The condition of Rev. Rufus P. Jones, rector of Trinity Episcopal Church, Saco, whose skull was fractured by a flying fragment of the exploded tank, was critical last night.

The body of the man whose head was blown off by the explosion, was identified as that of Dominick Lebreque, thirty-two years old, a clerk in a Portland store.

Estimates of the financial loss varied from half a million to \$800,000, the latter figure being set by one of the town assessors familiar with the property values. The insurance, it is believed, does not exceed \$200,000.

CRIMINAL LIBEL

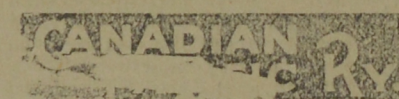
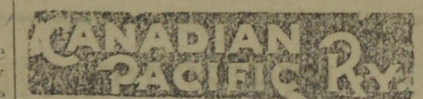
Rev. D. M. Gillis Summoned to Court
Complaint of a Sydney Lawyer

GLACE BAY, C. B., Aug. 10.

A sensation was created about the town when it was made known that Rev. D. M. Gillis, the pastor of one of the two prominent Presbyterian churches in this place, had been summoned to answer to a charge of criminal libel, the complainant being A. D. Gunn, barrister of this city.

Mr. Gillis, it is alleged, recently contributed an article to the Sydney Post, in the course of which he is alleged to have attacked the professional character of Mr. Gunn. Mr. Gillis came up before Magistrate McLean and was remanded in bonds of \$600 to appear on Wednesday of this week, when the preliminary hearing will be conducted.

Intense interest has developed in the case, and further developments will be keenly awaited. The letter on which the trial will be fought dealt with certain phases of the temperance question which recently agitated the minds of the county's electorate.
