A CONTRAST.

If any one had remained in doubt as to who were the real promoters of repeal he would have had his doubts dispelled yesterday had he attended the sheriff's court. At that court election agents were appointed and an opportunity was given to see who was who. The Scott Act was represented by men whose leadership any good citizen might feel it an honor to follow. The License Committee had as one of its most active leaders a gentleman of "the trade" whose name has appeared for many years past on the police court records as a persistent violator of law; and two of the most prominent among the agents—whose names appeared in yesterday's papers—were also men of "the trade" who have likewise a police court record.

A QUERY.

It is thus for the first time made public the manner of men who are behind the repeal movement. Are they a body of representative citizens desirous of seeing the drink traffic curtailed and the cause of temperance and righteousness advanced?

SCOTT ACT COMMITTEE.

FIRE CHIEFS ORGANIZE.

Chiefs of Province Met at St. John and formed an Association—They will control their own Sports.

A meeting of the fire chiefs and representatives of the fire departments of the province was held yesterday afternoon in the Royal Hotel, St. John. As a result an association was formed for the government of tournaments to be held in the future. Chief John Kerr, of St. John, is president. The next tournament will probably be held in Chatham in the fall.

Those present were:—Chief Kerr, of St. John; Chief Ackman of Moncton; Chief Rutter of Fredericton; Chief Daley, of Sussex; Captain Fitzpatrick at Chatham together with district chiefs Blake and Brown of St. John and a representative of the Fairville department.

The officers of the new association besides the president—Chief Kerr—are: Vice-president—Chief Rutter, Fredericton.

Sec.-treas.—Chief Ackman, Moncton.

Members of Executive—With the president and secretary, Chiefs Daley, of Sussex, Sweet, of Fairville and Carter of Sackville.

The new association will have the control of all tournaments held in connection with any of the fire departments of New Brunswick and the executive is to award all prizes. No tournament can be held by the firemen of the province without the sanction of the executive of the association.

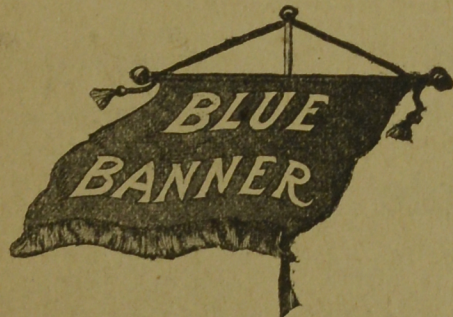
