POST OFFICE ROBBERY.

Several Packages Containing Large Sums of Money Have Disappeared.

WINNIPEG, May 18.—The thief who has been operating in the registry office department of the Winnipeg post office is still undetected, in spite of the most vigorous efforts by the government detectives to apprehend him. The series of robberies has extended over several months, and the sums stolen aggregate a very large amount—it is believed not less than \$12,000. It is impossible to ascertain the correct figures, but the sum cannot be less than stated. A number of packages containing from \$800 to \$2,000 have disappeared mysteriously, indicating that the thief is some person who has the handling of money entrusted to him, and that he is clever and systematic in his operations.

Suspicion at first rested upon a boy at the registry wicket, who received and checked off the money, and then passed it on to the entry clerk. It was thought by the officials that sufficient circumstantial evidence had been obtained to connect the lad with the disappearance of a package containing \$800 mailed by the Merchants' Bank, although it was impossible to convict him. He was promptly discharged, however, and his father was compelled to reimburse the postoffice department to the extent of \$1,200. The discharged clerk left the country shortly afterwards, but the speculations still continued, large sums disappearing as before, a fact that plainly indicated that the wrong party had been discharged. This fact had been learned by the gentleman who was required to repay the \$1,200 that his son was suspected to have stolen, and he proposes now to take action, seeking to have that amount returned to him, as he is convinced of his son's innocence.

It is thought to be not improbable that an organized gang is working within the postal service, as the robberies have not been confined to the Winnipeg office, but have occurred at several points throughout the west, when large sums have been in transit, the supposition being that a tip was passed to a confederate from some one in close touch with affairs in the head office. So successful and daring has the chief been in the city office that the department has issued instructions to the effect that in future registered mail is to be checked over by the postmaster, his assistant and the postoffice inspector's department.

PAUPER WEDS FINANCIER.

Ex-workhouse Inmate Now a Fashionable Hostess.

The romantic life story of a workhouse girl who, born in squalid poverty and brought up under the shadow of the Poor Law, is now the wife of a wealthy financier and a well known London West End hostess, has just come to light. The story of her rise from penury to wealth has been told by the Rev. Walter Hobbs, a member of the Lambeth Board of Guardians. Mr. Hobbs has for eighteen years been a prominent worker on the board. Recently he received a letter in a handwriting that was quite strange to him. It was on superfine notepaper, with a Mayfair address, and enclosed was a cheque.

The writer, a lady, stated that she could never forget Mr. Hobbs' kindness in past years, and was forwarding "a small donation" towards the "many good works" with which he was associated. She referred to a 400 miles motor tour she was enjoying on the Continent with her husband, and expressed her intention of calling on Mr. Hobbs.

Not many days afterwards a handsome carriage and pair drew up outside "Had don," the pastor's residence in Salter's Hill, and a lady stepped out, in whom he recognised a former protegee.

The lady's life history reads like a novel. Rescued when a baby from wretched surroundings in London, she was educated by the guardians and sent out at fifteen as a domestic servant. Her first place was in the house of an officer on the South Coast. Gossip was busy concerning her employer, and the lady guardians declined to visit his house. In consequence the board decided to fetch the girl back to the workhouse.

To Mr. Hobbs fell the task of escorting the girl back to London, and he was so much impressed with her anxiety to avoid the house that he took her to his own home and secured her another situation.

She went next to a West End nursing home. In the establishment came a wealthy lady to undergo an operation. The workhouse girl waited upon the nurses, and was so bright, pretty and ingenious that the aristocratic patient insisted on taking her to her own mansion to be her maid.

WIFE OF WELL KNOWN FINANCIER. The next chapter in the story was a proposal on the part of the lady's son, who persisted in his attention to the girl despite the opposition of his family. As a compromise it was arranged that she should be sent to a foreign university to be educated, and to test the endurance of their mutual affection.

The marriage took place some time ago, and the forlorn Lambeth child is now a fashionable hostess the wife of a well-known financier. The donation received by Mr. Hobbs shows that she is not ungrateful for all that was done for her.

Since her remarkable good fortune she has desired to discover the particulars of her parentage, and these have now been communicated to her. Though born in squalid surroundings, it appears that she is a descendant—as her bearing, even when a child made the guardians suspect—of an aristocratic family.
