SUPPOSED SUICIDE IS UNDER ARREST.

Howard Ogilvie Instead of Dying Merely Changed Names.

CHICAGO, Feb. 14.—Howard Mark Ogilvie, whose clothing was found on the Evanston lake shore last September, with a note announcing that he was about to commit suicide, is in custody in Philadelphia under the name of Sumner C. Osborne. He is wanted by the officers of University towns throughout the west.

Ogilvie eloped July 27th last with Miss Jane Roland, the 19-year-old daughter of L. B. Roland, of Evanston. The elopement created a sensation in Evanston. Afterward it was learned that the couple had gone to Canada. Soon warrants were issued against Ogilvie charging him with having uttered bogus checks. His wife

at once left him, returning to her father and resuming her maiden name. In spite of the danger of arrest Ogilvie followed her to Evanston and pleaded vainly with her to return. His suicide ruse was resorted to soon afterward.

Instead of throwing himself in the lake, however, he went to the University of Minnesota, where he became a student, and was initiated into Sigma Chi under the name of Osborne.

It is alleged that after swindling his fraternity brothers, he left there on Dec. 15 and went to the University of Nebraska, at Lincoln. There he is accused of having ingratiated himself with his fraternity brethren, and after cashing \$100 worth of checks, disappeared.

He went successively to the University of Missouri, at Columbia, the University of Kansas, at Lawrence, and to Syracuse University. He is said to have obtained from \$50 to \$150 on bogus checks at each place.

Yesterday a telegram was received from Philadelphia saying that the prisoner admitted he was Ogilvie.

TEACHERS' PAY INCREASED

Every Teacher in the Province gets a Large Government Grant—This could not have been done if the N. B. Government had not Succeeded in getting the Dominion Subsidy Increased

Opposition speakers are constantly crying that the government should give every teacher in the province. The only restriction placed in the bill was that the subsidy should not go into effect until the Dominion subsidy was paid over. One-half of the new arrangement New Brunswick year's subsidy has been paid over and every teacher in the province receives nearly five times as much per capita for the expenses of civil government as Ontario, and has been most generously treated in the distribution of subsidies. In his budget speech, Hon. Wm. Pugsley questioned the sincerity of the Opposition statements and challenged Mr. Hazen to move a resolution that the additional subsidy be declined. Mr. Hazen made no reply, because he knew thoroughly that the increased subsidy would be of great advantage to the province.

It must not be forgotten by those who directly benefit by the increased revenues of the province derived from this source that it was the New Brunswick government that kept the agitation alive, or more properly speaking revived the agitation which was responsible for the increased subsidies.

When the conference of provincial teachers, held in Quebec in 1887, passed resolutions asking the Dominion government to increase the subsidies paid to the provinces and sent them to Ottawa their receipt was never acknowledged by the federal authorities. No official notice was ever taken of the action of the provincial teachers until 1902. When the New Brunswick Government opened up correspondence with the other provinces the whole question was dormant. As a result of the correspondence sent by the New Brunswick Government to the conference, which was held at Quebec and the resolution passed in 1887, they met with a different reception from Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and in 1906 legislation was introduced in Parliament to increase the subsidies and the Imperial Parliament was asked to amend the British North America Act to give effect to the wish of the Canadian Parliament.

The re-adjustment of the subsidies was the direct result of the agitation started in 1902 by the New Brunswick Government. No effort of the opposition could make to hamper the Government was lacking to prevent the Government from obtaining just treatment from Ottawa. Had the Government not been successful in carrying the point raised it would not have been possible to have increased the pay of school teachers; there would have been less money for highways and bridges and other public services, and the sinking fund for the old debt would not have been possible. The Government did a great work for the Province by obtaining this increase in the subsidy.

The Government spent for education last year the large sum of \$220,750, which, next to public works, is the largest single item among the expenditures of the province, and \$54,016 more than the previous Government spent for this purpose in 1882, their last full year in office. Almost every year the educational grant has been increased, but notwithstanding this there was a general and well founded cry that the pay of school teachers was too small. There was a serious part of the Government to accede to the demand of the teachers, but until their subsidy question was settled there were financial difficulties in the way. Without a larger grant from Ottawa the salaries could not be increased without resorting to direct taxation.

Immediately the question of subsidies was settled and before it had been assented to by the British Parliament, the Government passed a bill through the House which in-
