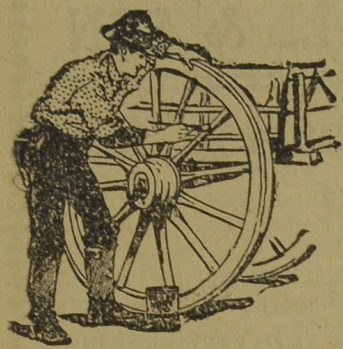

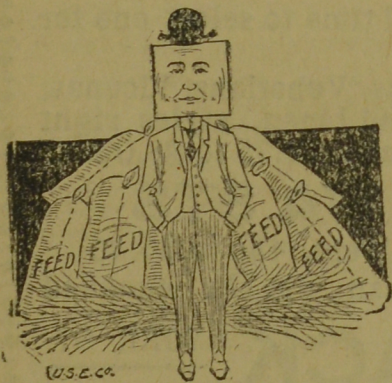

Shrimp Fricassee—Put a teaspoonful of lard in a saucepan, when it is hot stir in one spoonful of flour, stir over the fire until the flour is a rich brown, then add one onion chopped fine and when that has fried a little (but before it browns) add two table spoonfuls of tomatoes. Let it stew a little with the saucepan covered on a slow fire, then when the tomatoes have melted down add two cups of hot water, season to taste with salt pepper and cayenne. ONE YEAR'S ACCIDENTS

Fifty Deaths on National Transcontinental.

WINNEPEG, April 2.—The Telegram published a sensational article this morning concerning the large number of fatalities along the National Transcontinental, intimating that the administration and contractors were responsible, owing to the class of labor employed and the scale of wages paid.

"Sensational nonsense" was the comment of E. R. Paulin, the departmental engineer of the National Railway, when interviewed. "It is absolutely untrue," he continued, "that there have been any cases of men killed which have not been reported, and they have simply been buried in unconsecrated ground without any one knowing. There has not been a single accident, fatal or otherwise, of which I have not received full particulars, reported to me here, and what is more, they have all been reported to the commissioners in Ottawa. There is always a doctor within reach, and when an accident occurs that proves fatal the coroner has always been notified and has usually gone out.

Wherever possible we communicate with the relatives and give them full particulars, accompanied by affidavits as to how the accident occurred. I think it is very probable that we have been credited with some deaths which have occurred on the C. P. R. double tracking. But even if the number of fifty is correct, it is not abnormal for the number of men employed and the magnitude of the work. In fact, I venture to say that it will compare favorably with any other similar work."

"Is it true that any particular brand of explosive is being forced on the men, and that it is defective?" "There is not a word of truth in it. There is not a single word in any of the contracts specifying any particular kind of explosive. They may use what they like, so long as it will shift rock."

Mr. Paulin said that over 70,000 men were now engaged on the work and he did not think from his experience that a total of 50 deaths in the year was an extraordinarily large average on a work of such magnitude.

NEW UNIVERSITIES FOR IRELAND.

Mr. Birrell Outlines His Plan in British Commons—Mr Balfour Approves

LONDON, April 2.—Chief Secretary for Ireland Birrell introduced his Irish university bill in the House of Commons to-day. There was a full attendance of members, and a large number of visitors crowded the galleries.

The central idea of Mr. Birrell's project is to found by royal charter two new universities in Ireland, with headquarters in Dublin and Belfast. The secretary explained that the Dublin University would be composed of three constituent branches two of which, Cork and Galway, existed already, and the third new college to be founded at Dublin. The existing Queen's College at Belfast was to constitute the proposed new northern university, which probably will be called the university of Belfast. Opinion at present is divided as to whether to call the Dublin seat of learning St. Patrick's University or the University of Ireland.

MR. BALFOUR APPROVES

Incidentally Chief Secretary Birrell defended Mr. James Bryce, who has been subjected to criticism in connection with his outline of a university scheme given out just before he became British Ambassador to the United States.

Mr. Birrell referred to Mr. Bryce, who preceded him in the office of Chief Secretary for Ireland, as being "busily and nobly engaged in re-

moving all possible causes of dispute between Great Britain and the United States."

Mr. A. J. Balfour warmly approved the broad lines of Mr. Birrell's scheme, and Mr. John Dillon on behalf of the Irish party also pressed approval, and assured the Government that it would have Catholic support in carrying the project through.

NO RELIGIOUS TESTS.

The new universities are to be governed by Senates to be elected by the colleges. The professors are to be appointed and may be dismissed by the Senates, but they will have the right to appeal against dismissal. The Crown is to have the right of making certain nominations to the Senates. No religious test is to be applied to professors, students, or graduates, and no public money is to be spent in theological or religious teaching. The present annual exchequer grant of \$182,500, which is divided among the four existing colleges is to be increased to \$400,000 and divided between the two new universities.

Belfast is to be given a building fund of \$750,000. The head of the new Dublin building is to be a Roman Catholic layman. Mr. Birrell's scheme does not affect Trinity College, Dublin.
