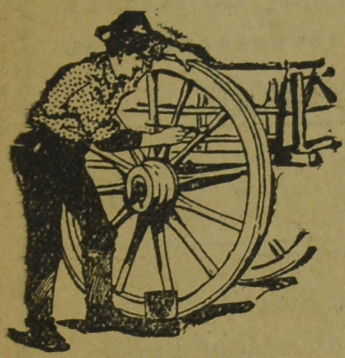

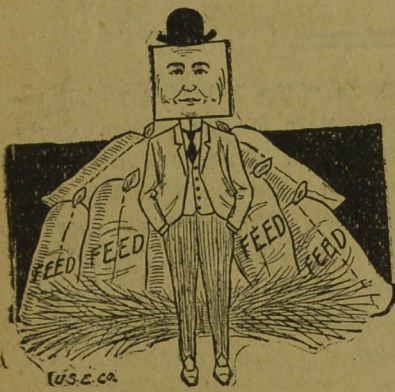

## IMPERIAL LINK TIGHT ENOUGH.

Armand Lavergne, M. P., is Violently Opposed to a Further Welding--If the French Navy Attacked Canada, French-Canadians, He Says, Would Defend the Dominion.

St. Catharines, Ont., April 8.—"We are violently opposed to any tightening of the Imperial link."

"The first duty of the French-Canadian, and his only personal ambition, is to resist racial absorption."

"The French-Canadian is more French intellectually than he was twenty-five years ago; but at the same time less French ethnically and politically."

"Should the French navy attack the shores of Canada, the French-Canadian could be relied upon for the defence of the country against the tri-color."

"Loyal as we are to our great Confederation, we would not hesitate to break it if the cost of maintaining it were our national existence."

As indicating the position occupied by the French-Canadian in the Confederation, Mr. Armand Lavergne, M. P. for Montmagny, Quebec, gave utterance to these expressions in an address before the Canadian Club here a few days ago.

In his general position, Mr. Lavergne followed closely the views of his erstwhile leader in the Commons, Mr. Henri Bourassa, formerly member for Labelle, refusing to go beyond the bounds of Canada for the defence of the Empire, demanding the continuance of the French language and the equality of the French Canadian; but not as insistent on Canada's ultimate independence as is Mr. Bourassa.

## DISEASED OF ALL KINDS.

Quite naturally, Mr. Lavergne reached the topic of immigration to Canada, and seldom has more pointed language described the policy of the past.

"Canada has been advertised the world over as a patent medicine," he declared. "The result is that today all the diseased are coming to us; diseased body, diseased in mind, diseased in soul; they are coming to Canada. Shall we succeed in making sound Canadians of them? I fear not. When the United States received the proportion of the immigrants we are now receiving they were 50,000,000 of population."

"We are now seven millions, and they are coming at a rate making assimilation impossible; and in ten or twenty years from now it is a certainty that the Canadian-born population will be the minority—the insignificant minority."

"Some think, sir, that in filling up our country we are preparing its prosperity. There is the moral, the intellectual and the material prosperity of a country; it seems to me we are sacrificing the two first ones—the most important—to the latter."

Even the latter was endangered, for only the land speculator got a profit. So far Canada had been free from the acute stage of the great social question.

"In throwing open our doors to every newcomer, in searching charitable institutions to recruit immigrants, in institutions which call as I have seen, for tramps, hooligans, drunkards, ex-convicts, etc., we are preparing a population of degenerates, and of invalids and of mental cranks."

In taking this view he was a "little Canadian," he said, as in England there were "little Englishmen."

"There is but one Canada, and that is for Canadians."

Mr. Lavergne is only 27, but has been in Parliament since the elections of 1903. He has been described as "beau garcon, dandy, finicky where the color of his cravat or the hang of his coat is in question, like one himself."

## THE FRENCH-CANADIAN.

He opened his address with a humorous denial of the general conception of a French-Canadian. For himself he had left his possessions at home; he was not called Baptiste, although he had a great grand-uncle who was—he had, it was true, a very small number of dollars; but a very large number of children, none, in fact, nor did he pay the cure any rent.

Equal rights for both races was the fundamental principle of Confederation, but in some respects this had not been granted.

The English-speaking Protestant minority received the most generous treatment in Quebec, but the French-Catholic minority in the other Provinces had its constitutional privileges violently assailed and often curtailed.

The French-Canadian was not disloyal because he was attached to his language; nor for his love of his religion was he priest-ridden. Twice he had saved Canada for the British Crown, and was now "loyally Canadian," exclusively Canadian.

There was a feeling of profound gratitude toward the "old world," by their patriotic efforts, and their "our faith." Nor did they ever interfere in purely political affairs.

The link with England was none the less strong for not being purely sentimental; it was gratitude for the gift of liberty.

The Empire could be served best by Canadians developing their own country. Complete autonomy was the strongest link of Empire.

"As long as Canada is respected in her rights of self government, England will have our hearts to love her and our arms to defend her."

A denial of equal rights was found he claimed, in the fact that in schools of the Northwest and Manitoba, French was classed as a foreign language.

"More conscientiously opposed to nonsectarian schools than to Protestant ones, we resent that our Separatist School system has been abolished in almost every Province except Ontario and Quebec, when it was based upon the very letter of our Canadian constitution and the solemn pledge of the sovereign."

It was too late to have only one language in Canada. Thank God, it was too late, for it was a source of strength and future glory, as it had proved in Switzerland and in Belgium.

Wille French-Canadians would defend Canada against France, they would resent bitterly having to pay for war against France outside of Canada. This was a contingency of adopting narrow Imperialism.

"We are satisfied with our lot, if the spirit of our dual country be well understood and put into practice. We want to have our share in the building of our country, so that when the time has come our nation takes proudly and strongly her rank amongst the other nations of the world. I see in the future the two old enemies of Europe really united in America in the love of our land, and working for the same end, a strong, healthy population, not too enormous, but moral and progressive with the same ideal, their family, their country and their God."
