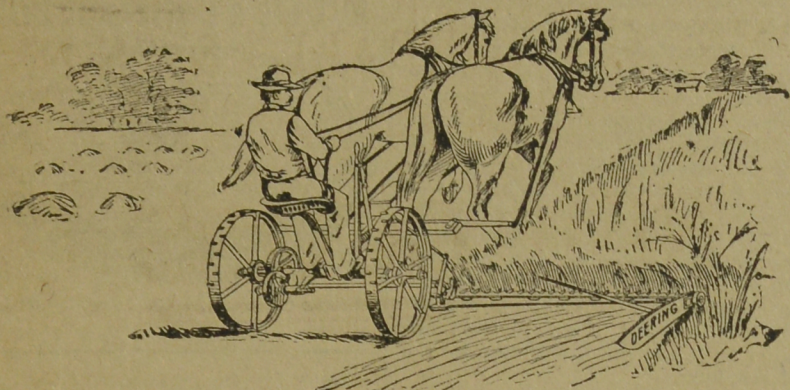

It was stated his actions proved highly embarrassing to Sir Lomer Gouin, and the Government. Inquiry failed to show that there was any truth in the statement, and today it is announced that Mr. Roy is taking an action for \$20,000 damages against La Patrie.
