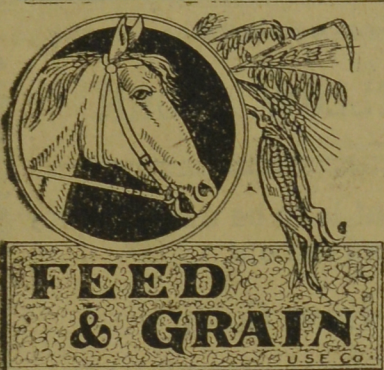

DUTY ON PEARL NECKLACE.

Mrs. W. W. Leeds Must Pay the Sum of \$204.000.

NEW YORK, June 2.—Customs duties of sixty per cent. must be paid on the \$340,000 pearl necklace imported from France by Mrs. William B. Leeds, under a decision rendered by Judge Lacombe in the United States court yesterday. After the necklace was purchased in Paris, the pearls were separated and brought to the United States as individual gems in the belief that they would be admitted upon the payment of ten per cent duty, which the law provides for individual pearls. The collector of the port ruled, however, that the sixty per cent must be paid, and his ruling is now upheld.

ACID IN MAN'S FACE.

Jealous Woman Nearly Blinds Ed. Chandler of Toronto.

Toronto Globe: A woman whose name has not been disclosed threw the contents of a bottle of carbolic acid full in the face of Edward Chandler, 216 Lee Avenue, on Monday night as he was going home from work at J. B. Smith & Company's Chandler, who is physical instructor at the St. Charles Athletic club, said that when he first saw his assailant she was sitting on the grass on Lee avenue, evidently waiting for him as he came home from work. She got up when he approached and saluted him familiarly, and as the old acquaintance she was.

Not another word did he hear, but was struck in the face across the eyes, forehead and nose with the biting acid, and he went down writhing with the great pain. The woman left him there, and boarding a car proceeded on it to her home in the west of the city. She is quite

well known to Chandler, but he is not willing to give her name to the public.

He was picked up by two men and taken to Tamblin's drug store, where Dr. Coates bandaged his eyes and relieved his sufferings as much as possible. He thinks that his eyesight will be saved to Chandler, but that he has had a very close call. The woman is described as being about 28, tall and dressed in dark clothes. She is married and has two children.

Chandler once lived on Bartlett avenue, but left the west to escape the importunities of the woman who assaulted him on Monday. No report of the occurrence has been made to the police, and Chandler himself says that he will not prosecute. He says that he has received letters from her at J. B. Smith & Company's factory, where he works, telling him to leave his wife, but that he has paid no heed to the jealous appeals.

PROTECT THE BIRDS.

Birds are of great economic value to fruit growers and gardeners. When they are protected and encouraged, the orchardist or gardener gains more than is generally appreciated. They keep in check great numbers of insects and vermin. It is true, that a few species are partial in diet to fruit and other crops, but the brief season of crop pilfering is a comparatively insignificant part of the other. There are many instances where birds have been killed because of their destruction to fruit, when an examination of their stomachs showed that they were eating more insects than fruit.

"There are few instances where birds become so abundant as to do more real harm than good. For although some of the birds eat fruit, this is not the main part of their diet. The majority of the birds are continually hunting and catching insects. During the breeding season, they live largely and rear their young almost exclusively on this food. Wherever insect food is plentiful, the birds resort to such a locality."

No person should be so blinded to his own best interests as to destroy by wholesale, creatures which are his best friends. Because birds occasionally make raids upon the orchard is no good reason for slaughtering them. Treat them as you would domestic animals when they commit devastations; in the case of animals, protect the crops from future raids by erecting or strengthening barriers; for birds, use decoy fruit trees, bird netting, scare-crows, and so forth. The birds are preserved, thereby, to turn their energies to better account in destroying insect pests. Birds are among the most valuable assets of the farm, the orchard and the garden. Protect them.

A CORRECTION

Facts in Connection with the Death of Mrs. Edward Carpenter.

Office of the Committee on Publication of The First Church of Christ Scientist.

To the Editor of the Herald, Fredericton, N. B.

Dear Sir.—The dispatch to your paper from Asheville, N. C., dated May 24th, concerning the death of Mr. Edward Carpenter has been investigated by us and has been found to misrepresent the facts. Indeed, the reporter who sent out the dispatch has acknowledged that he did so without making any investigation, and that he was wrong.

The facts are that Mr. Carpenter died on a Tuesday evening about 8 o'clock, of an attack of heart failure. As Mrs. Carpenter and a woman relative were alone in the house, one or two Christian Science friends were asked to come and help them lift the body which had fallen over onto the floor. Since on former occasions Mr. Carpenter had had attacks of heart failure and unconsciousness, from which he had recovered in a few hours' time, Mrs. Carpenter very naturally hoped that he would revive. On the following morning a neighboring physician was called and the undertaker was also summoned. The physician pronounced Mr. Carpenter dead. The undertaker took charge and did all that was necessary, except to embalm the body, as Mrs. Carpenter said that she had not lost hope of her husband reviving.

On the fourth day the doctor was again called and made a thorough examination and said that there was no sign of life, after which the body was prepared for shipment to Savannah, Ga.

The physician has justified Mrs. Carpenter's course, and said if he had been in her place he would have done the same; that there was absolutely no reason why she should not have waited as long as she did. He assured the Christian Scientists that

there was nothing unusual and nothing worthy of criticism in the way the case had been managed.

The remains were not "spirited away." The undertaker's work was done at the residence. I have a statement from the undertakers, Nostrand & Brown of Asheville, repudiating the report which appeared in the newspapers.
