CAPITALS WON .8 TO 2

Defeated the Crescents in Keen Hockey Match at the
Marysville Rink.

MARYSVILLE, Feb. 7.—Fully six
hundred people witnessed a great
game of hockey in the Marysville
rink last evening, when the Frederic-
ton Capitals crossed sticks with the
Marysville Crescents. In the first
game of the second round of the Pro-
vincial League, Will Cain and Eddie
Dennison of last year's Crescents,
made their first appearance this sea-
son last night. Cain played his old
position at cover point, in Fred Gib-
son's place, while Dennison played on
the wing, Hovey going to centre.
Considering that Cain and Dennison
have had no practice this season they
played excellent hockey, while Hovey
played well at centre, although the
Capitals was too fast for the local
boys.

Burns played good hockey for
Marysville, and was very active from
start to finish. In the first half he
rover and made several shots for
goal, which went wide. He also
seemed to fall a great deal. Fuller-
ton as usual played well and made
some excellent stops, Brogan played
his position in good style and check-
ed hard, saving a good many danger-
ous shots.

For Fredericton all the boys played
well, Musick made some of his fam-
ous rushes from one end of the rink
to the other, and on one occasion
scored after passing through the en-
tire Crescent team. Features of the
game were the delays and off side
plays. One goal which Fredericton
claims they got was not allowed.
Goal Judge George Robertson stating
that it did not go into the net.

On one occasion Referee Staples
was knocked out by getting a crack
in the ribs from one of the Frederic-
ton players in a mix up.

THE GAME

The game started at 8.30, and was
fast from the first, Marysville setting
the pace. After playing one minute
Jimmie Williams shot goal No. 1 for
Fredericton. It was done so quickly
that it rather discouraged the Cres-
cents. After playing ten minutes
Stuart shot goal No. 2 from a mix-
up. Then the play got faster than
ever. Williams got the puck and
made a gallant rush, and when near
the Marysville net passed to Dunphy,
who carried the puck into the net.
Fredericton 3; Marysville 0.

From the face of Burns got the
puck, and after a desperate rush
scored for the Crescents, amidst
great cheering. Just four minutes be-
fore half time Murphy in a pass
scored again.

Fredericton 4; Marysville 1.

SECOND HALF

Play started faster than ever, both
teams trying hard to score. The
playing, as in the first half, was
mostly in the Fredericton territory.
Morrison had several hot ones to
stop, as Burns and Dennison were
shooting fast and often. In 6½ min-
utes Williams scored for his team
after a good rush. One minute later
Stuart netted another one from a
pass by Murphy. Both teams were
playing very fast, taking all the ad-
vantages possible. From a face off
in front of the Fredericton net Hovey
scored for Marysville. As the game
continued the Fredericton boys got
faster, while Marysville seemed lack-
ing in speed and shot weak. After a
long rush Murphy shot goal No. 7
for Fredericton, which play was soon
followed by Musick taking the puck
the entire length of the rink and
scoring the 8th and last goal of the
game. For the remaining few min-
utes honors were about even, and the
game ended with the puck near the
Marysville end.

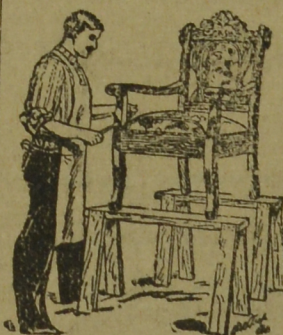

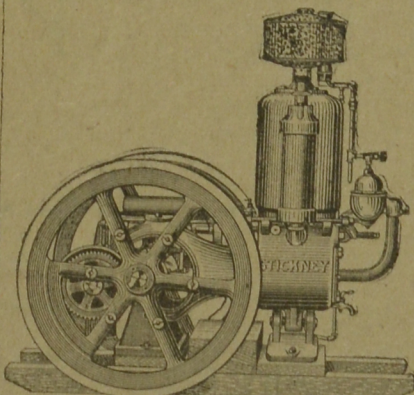
