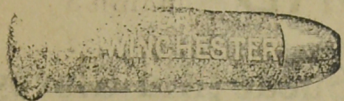

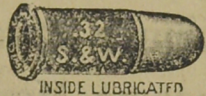

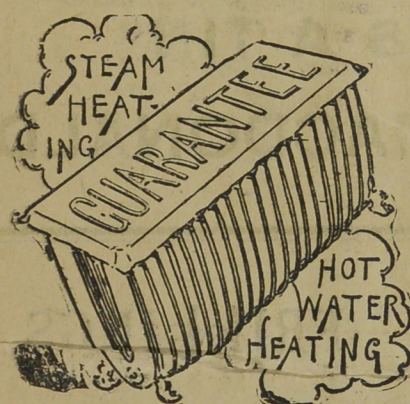

SENSELESS SCANDAL TALK

Preacher Says He Will Believe No Charges Against Public Men Till After Election.

TORONTO, Oct. 20.—In the course of his sermon at the Western Congregational church on Sunday evening, Rev. J. W. Pedley, the pastor, said:

"I don't know how it has come to pass," said he, "perhaps they themselves are responsible, but the most malignant class of men in any community are the politicians. It may be that it is the natural outcome of our party system, which drives two sets of men at one another's throats every four years. I saw a picture last week representing Bryan and Taft slinging ink-bottles at each other, and splashed all over with the contents. That is a picture of political warfare, and instead of argument we have abuse, vilification, destruction."

"I don't know how it is, but at every election there is an outbreak of the most venomous, reckless, indiscriminate abuse which makes Sir Wilfrid Laurier as bad as all the rest of them in his party, and which makes Mr. Borden as bad as all the rest of them in his party. There is no reason or sense in this kind of political warfare, and I for one refuse to join in it."

DREADFULLY HARMFUL. "I know—Grits I was going to say—(Laughter)—Reformers in my congregation, and they are good men; I know Conservatives in my congregation, and they are good men; and am I to stand and join in the hue and cry of political fools who gather the whole party into one group and turn on the hose of unmitigated slander? I will not join in it. I protest against that idea of political warfare, both because it is false and because I know of nothing more dreadfully harmful than that to the general well-being of the country."

"I wonder if the newspapers—for I hold them largely responsible—realize the impression on the rising generation it must have to be constantly telling the people that men are unsound, rotten at heart, unworthy of confidence and trust. HAZEN AND THE WORKINGMEN

Says His Work is Worth 50 cents a Day in Winter, and \$1.00 in Summer. The Dominion Government Pays \$1.75.

Have the workingmen of New Brunswick worthy of note in this connection wick ever stopped to consider what the Liberal government of the Mr. Hazen really thinks of them? In his speeches of course he is their true friend, the best friend they ever had, and all that. But a fairer test of his real feeling is what he has done rather than what he has said.

A DOLLAR A DAY.

The Highway Act recently prepared and rushed through the legislature by Mr. Hazen and his government provides more reliable evidence of the value he places upon a man who works with his hands. For instance, Section 18 of the act sets forth that if the highway board in any parish deem it expedient, "the resident rate-payers of any parish or of any of the districts in a parish may be permitted and allowed to perform labor upon the highways in lieu of a money payment such labor to be performed at the rate of twelve and one-half cents per hour, or one dollar per day of eight hours; and in the manner herein-after provided."

That is Mr. Hazen's figures that a New Brunswick man's fair wage for a fair day's work is \$1. And that after raising his poll tax from \$1 to \$2. It

But this is not the worst. These prices established by the Highway Act apply only to statute labor on the roads in the summer. Throughout the country in the winter it frequently becomes necessary for arduous work

to be undertaken to clear the roads of accumulated snow, and section 56 subsections 1 and 3 of Mr. Hazen's act provides that:

(1) For the purpose of breaking open or making payable the highways in winter, it shall be lawful for the surveyor, either by verbal or written notice, to summon so many of the rate inhabitants in his sub-section to turn out with such horses teams, sleds, sleighs or other necessary implements which they may have, or which may be under their control to break out and clear the highway in his sub-section and to haul or shovel now in, to, or off the same from time to time as the surveyor may deem necessary and any person so summoned and neglecting or refusing to comply with such notice shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty of two dollars for each such neglect or refusal, and any surveyor who upon the request of the ratepayer shall not discharge his duty in notifying the inhabitant as aforesaid shall, upon conviction, be liable for the same penalty for each neglect or refusal to do so.

(2) "Persons and teams shall be rate at one-half the rate allowed for statute labor."

That is, for winter work of the hardest and most disagreeable kind, Mr. Hazen and his government will only pay a man at the rate of 50 cents per day under penalty of \$2.00 fine if he refuses to work under these conditions.

Colchester Tories Received Several Cases from Halifax.

TRURO, Oct. 19.—A seizure of 11-Chief Gass opened all the packages was reported by Liberals here and found the contents to be bottles of liquid. After reclosing the boxes he instructed the express agent not to deliver any of them excepting to persons assembling whiskey cases.
