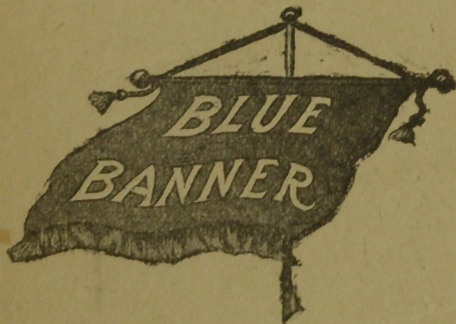

### THE MOUNT PROPERTY

Mr. G. H. Pick Takes Possession on a Writ of Ejectment.

After a struggle in the courts extending over a period of several years, Mr. Geo. H. Pick of Moncton, is now in possession of the wooden building and lot on Queen Street, occupied by Mr. Dugald McCatherine. It will be remembered that after the equity court decided that Mr. Pick was the rightful owner of the property, the local government stepped in and took possession, and for some months the Deputy Receiver General has been collecting the rent from Mr. McCatherine.

A short time ago Mr. Pick commenced an action of ejectment against Mr. McCatherine and obtained judgment by default. Mr. McCatherine thought that the government would defend the suit and their failure to do so is taken as an indication that they have abandoned all claims to the property.

This morning Sheriff Sterling and Mr. C. H. Allen, visited Mr. McCatherine's place of business and served the writ of ejectment, and took possession of the property. Mr. McCatherine was compelled to execute a temporary lease to Mr. Pick to save himself from being ejected along with his goods and chattels, and it is understood will execute a permanent lease at a later date. In the lease he acknowledges Mr. Pick as his landlord and will pay the rent to him in future. Some time ago Mr. Pick obtained a deed of the property from two heirs of the late Miss Mount living in Nova Scotia.
