Sir: In his desperate efforts to earn his pay, the doughty Liquor License Champion seems to depend mainly upon just two principles, senseless repetition of a false statement, and the telling of a half truth to deceive the public. A most striking example of his tactics was given when he stated that almost every constituency in Ontario had repealed the Scott Act, seeking to convey the impress on that Local Option had been a failure in Ontario. The truth is that the Scott Act was repealed in nearly all these constituencies only that a more stringent local option law might be enacted in its stead.
