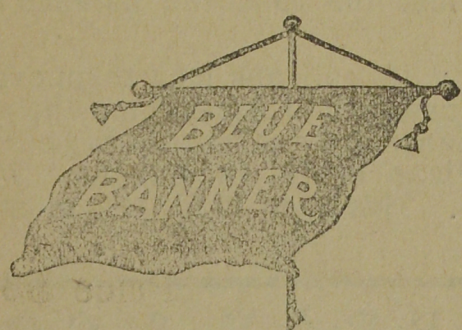

only about \$11,000.

The Prince and Princess of Wales' garden. The gross earnings of the company have grown from the sum of \$226,225 for the year 1908 to the sum of \$230,595.03 for the eleven months covered by this report and the number of telephones installed has been increased from 7,536 to 8,410, an increase of 874 phones for the eleven months.

The net earnings of the company, however, cannot be considered to be entirely satisfactory. The statement shows, it is true, that the directors have appropriated out of revenue the sum of \$11,000 for commissions on the sale of the company's stock and to this amount must also be added a considerable amount for the stockholders who under the terms upon which the stock was issued became entitled to interest by reason of anticipating this payment of the instalments due on stock. At the same time stockholders were paid a dividend on their stock and thus the interest paid was so much additional paid by the company over and above dividends.

The directors have also charged up to revenue the sum of \$20,991.07, which was expended in restoring the original value to the property of the company and is therefore an item of depreciation. At the same time rental charges being less than those charged by other similar companies doing business in Canada and the balance carried to reserve being less than your directors deem advisable, the necessity of an increase in the rental charges is clearly demonstrated.

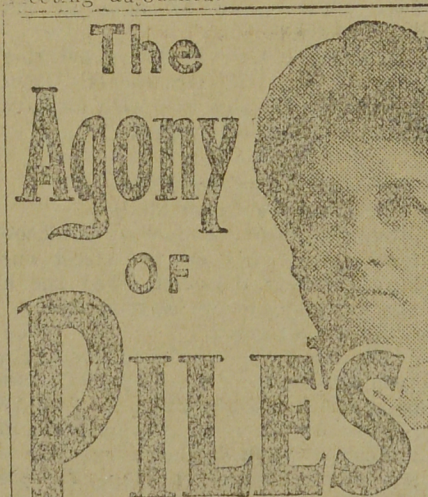
The directors during the year have placed the company on a semi-annual dividend basis at the rate of 6 per cent per annum. Your directors felt that the shareholders were entitled to receive a dividend of at least six per cent on their investment and that the company could practically as well pay such a dividend half-yearly as annually. In only required that the company make its collections more promptly that it probably would otherwise make and this in itself is not an unmitigated evil.

Your directors are pleased to report that during the year they have made uniform throughout the province the toll rates of the company. This step has resulted in not so much adding to the receipts of the company as benefiting its service to its patrons and in the better facility afforded in attending to the business of the company. At first it was supposed by the public that the rates were being unduly increased but your directors are now pleased to observe that the public are satisfied that the change is actually one in their own interests.

The following directors were elected for the ensuing year: S. H. White, Hon. F. P. Thompson, F. B. Black, F. B. Carvell, M.P., A. W. Bennett, R. O'Leary, J. D. Irving, R. B. Emerson, J. M. Robinson, W. B. Snowball, A. R. Slipp, M.P.P., L. B. McFarlane, F. W. Sumner, H. P. Robinson, G. W. Ganong.

At a subsequent meeting of the directors the following officers were elected: President, S. H. White; first vice-president, Hon. F. P. Thompson; second vice-president, F. B. Black; secretary-treasurer, A. W. McMacdonell; general manager, H. P. Robinson.

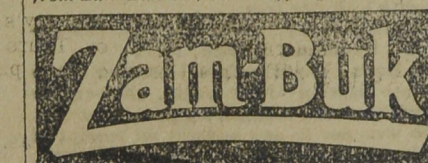
