ANOTHER IN LINE.**North Lake Highway Board Meets and Appoints Officials.**

The Herald is not often able to report on the meetings of the North Lake Highway Board, met and organized on May 20th.

The Board is composed of councilor Cropley, who was elected chairman, and Councilor Farrell, and Thomas Wetmore, secretary-treasurer.

The Parish was divided as follows: District A.—From Forest City to Posterville. Arthur Wetmore, commissioner, sub-divided as follows:

Sub-District 1.—From Forest City to H. Clarke's line, between the arms of Clark and John G. Graham. Frank Patterson, surveyor.

2.—From John Graham's line to Poplar Brook. Hugh Graham, surveyor.

3.—From Poplar Brook to the dividing line between H. B. Boone's and Edgar Cropley's. John Foster, surveyor.

4.—From H. B. Boone's line to Posterville. Austin Kinney, surveyor.

5.—From Mountain School House to George Wood Jr.'s line. Solomon Buckingham, surveyor.

District B.—From the boundary line to Ed river bridge. William Gaskin, Commissioner.

District C.—From Smith Church to Maxwell school house, including the Ivey bye-road. Samuel Graham, Commissioner.

District D.—From Maxwell to County line between Carleton and York. Henry Hawkes, Commissioner. Joseph Hall, Surveyor.

AFTER COCAINE SELLERS.

Montreal Pharmaceutical Association Has Warm Election.

Montreal, Que., June 9.—The Pharmaceutical Association election was a bitter fight between the old council and the cocaine sellers. Two druggists, who had been convicted for selling cocaine, were up for election but were defeated. They were strong enough, however, in a secret ballot to oust one of the chief instigators for the prosecutions, Ad. Levesque.

The Lee Chu case also came up for discussion and it was decided to arrest him as soon as he came out of Halifax jail on the charge of subordination of perjury. When they get him here the court will collect the \$1,000 which he owes on fines for selling cocaine.

Telegraphy in China.

The first telegraph line was opened in China in 1872, and there are now about 15,000 miles of line, the whole under imperial control. The Chinese language being syllabic and not alphabetic, many may wonder how a message is transmitted. The method is simple, but ingenious. There are as many characters as words in the Chinese language, and the messages are sent in number cipher. When the numbers are received at the other end a double ended type is used with numbers at one end and characters at the reverse. A message is set up by the numbers and then printed from the reverse end, which shows the characters.—London Globe.

Stones In Pocket to Keep Body Down.
Belleville, June 8.—The body of an unidentified man was found in the bay yesterday. In both pockets of the overcoat were large, heavy stones, and it looks like a deliberate case of suicide.

Election Protest Dismissed.
Ottawa, June 8.—The petition against the election of G. F. Hodgins, M.P., for Pontiac, on the grounds of bribery and corruption, has been dismissed by Judge Champagne at Bryson.

A Year for Burglary.
St. Thomas, June 8.—Arthur Mann was yesterday sentenced to one year in the Central Prison for burglarizing a barber shop.

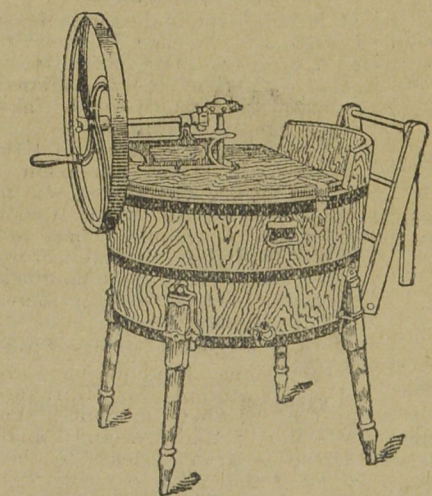
