FIRE AT GIBSON.

A large brush fire in the rear of Sunnyside cemetery broke out about two o'clock this afternoon and is burning quite badly but as there are no buildings very near, not very much damage will result.

A CLEAN SHEET.

There was a clean sheet at the police court this morning, which speaks pretty well for the law and order of the city after a public holiday.

PROMINENT LAWYER DEAD.

Toronto, Sept. 7.—(Special)—Alfred Henry Marsh, K. C., a member of the law firm of Marsh and Cameron, and one of the most widely known barristers in the province, died of heart failure last evening, while swimming in a lake at Central Island, about one hundred yards from his summer residence.

Mr. Marsh, who had practised his profession in Toronto for over thirty years, was in his fifty-ninth year. He was at one time in partnership with the late Sir John Macdonald.

THIRTEEN CHINESE GO TO JAIL.

Kingston, Sept. 4.—Refusing to pay a fine of \$3 and costs for non-payment of laundry tax, thirteen Chinamen last night went to jail for ten days. Their shops are now closed. They cannot do business unless a license is taken out.

Four ecclesiastics refused to obey the summons to attend court, and the police had a lively chase before they landed them. A. B. Cunningham, their counsel, is taking steps to have the bylaw passed by the City Council, increasing the tax from \$5 to \$50 quashed.

City Engineer Craig has been granted permission to give oil a trial on the city streets.

FREIGHT HITS WAGON.

Williamsburg, Sept. 4.—Nineteen persons were severely injured, two probably fatally, Thursday night, when the hay wagon in which they were being taken to a corn roast was struck by a freight engine at the St. Clair crossing of the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Dorothy Henderson and Edna Snively of this place were caught in the upset wagon and dragged a great distance. Both were injured internally, and their condition is critical.

The seventeen others, all young women and men, were painfully cut and bruised.

Garage Collapses.

Brantford, Sept. 4.—Owing to building operations being conducted on Dalhousie street, by the Brantford Realty Co., the building known as the Brantford Garage collapsed at 7 o'clock last evening, burying five automobiles in the debris, including a new Russell car. An excavation next to the building it is thought caused the collapse, and the two employees, by good fortune, were outside at the time. They had a narrow escape. The loss will be heavy.

Three Thousand Smiths Together. Seattle, Wash., Sept. 4.—Three thousand named Smith gathered in the exposition auditorium yesterday for a reunion of the Smith family, among them being many Indians and Eskimos.

Donald Smith, better known as Lord Strathcona, regarded as the richest Smith in the world, sent his regrets at inability to attend owing to illness.

Each tender must be signed and sealed by all the parties to the tender, and witnessed, and be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered bank of the Dominion of Canada payable to the Commissioners of the Transcontinental Railway, for the sum equal to five per cent (5 p. c.) of the amount of the tender.

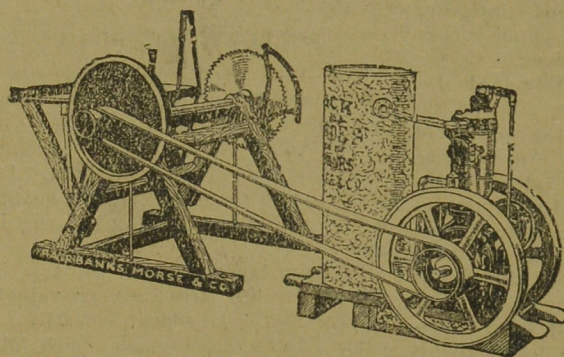
