

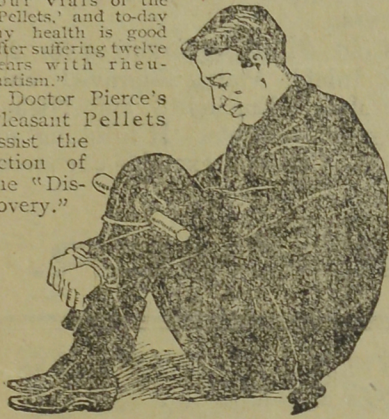

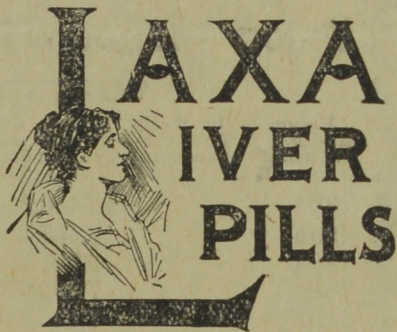
Fair Bargain.

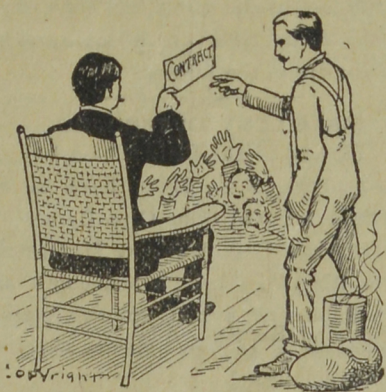
